

CALIFORNIA SENATE BILL (SB) 1383, **EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2022, SETS THE FOLLOWING GOALS FOR 2025:**

75% REDUCTION IN ORGANIC WASTE

20% RECOVERY OF **EDIBLE FOOD WASTE**

SB 1383 requires municipalities and haulers to develop and implement programs to:

- Adopt enforceable ordinances and mechanisms to monitor and enforce compliance
- Provide organics collection services to all residents and businesses
- Establish an Edible Food Recovery Program
- Conduct education and outreach to the community
- Procure recycled organic waste products

LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO ENFORCE STARTING JANUARY 1, 2024.
