I want to show you a "super-ninja" picture book trick that will:

- Save you money by not having to order an illustration for every single page of your picture book
- Double the page count of any picture book (which can be useful to reach the 24 page minimum for KDP Print books)
- Set up a visual repetition which can be useful for certain picture book text & stories












Here's an easy alternative to laying out your picture books:

You can simply alternate between an illustration and a "text-only" image display on every other page in your manuscript:


