


# FISHHOOK

In Psalm 90, Moses laments how quickly life flies away, and how our sin grants us only one thing: death. Yet he begins this dirge with words of praise: "Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God" (vv. 1-2). As we prepare to celebrate 80 years at St. Andrews, it is right to give God thanks and praise for everything that He has done in us, through us, and for us as His people.

A little bit later on in Psalm 90, Moses continues, "The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away" (v. 10). There is truth in Moses' statement: our lives are but grass. The grass withers and

the flower fades. We will not live forever, unless Christ comes before He calls us home. (continued next page)

(continued from first page) Nevertheless, in spite of this very true reality, we need not lament the way Moses did as we celebrate 80 years of the Lord working through St. Andrews. And that's because even though most, if not all, who helped found St. Andrews are now with our Lord, and even though we will also be with Him in blessed death at some point, the Word of the Lord and His promises endure forever.

And that is precisely why St. Andrews is still here. Not because of our hard work, or because we've done everything right. I hope that we can all agree on that. We are still here at 4910 Claremont Ave. because of the grace and mercy of God. In fact, it is solely because of Him that we remain a community centered on the love and forgiveness He has for each and every one of us.

At St. Andrews we preach, teach, work through, and center our lives in Christ crucified for sinners. God promises life everlasting through the death and resurrection of His Son. And this is what gives us identity, purpose, and hope.

So even as we give God thanks and praise for the "glory days" and the "golden years" of St. Andrews, let us be bold in trusting the Lord for the future. Let us listen to His words of Law and Gospel, Rebuke and Promise, so that we might know and believe in Christ our Lord. As St. Paul proclaims in his letter to the Philippians:

Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. (3:12-14)

Let us find ourselves in Jesus—as He comes quickly—so that we might know, in deeper ways, the loving mysteries of God.



## **Letter from Pastor Dan**

August 23, 2023

To the saints of St. Andrews:

On Sunday afternoon, August 20, I was informed by members of Christ the King Lutheran Church in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, that their congregation had voted to call me as their senior pastor. This is the first time this has occurred in my over-seventeen years serving as your pastor (and only the second time it's occurred in the last fifty-plus years at St. Andrews).

What does this mean? It means that I now have two calls as a senior pastor and must prayerfully discern which one to keep and which one to let go. It means my family and I must pray and determine whether to stay with you here in Stockton or begin a new chapter of our life and ministry in Coeur d'Alene. This is not easy for us. Why would we leave our beloved church, our amazing friends, and almost all of our family? Only if we believe God is calling us to do so. I realize it is hard to understand that you can be happy in one place and yet be open to leaving. It comes from the belief, formed in pastors, to be open to the calling of God.

This may come as a surprise to you. If you react like we have, you will have a lot of mixed emotions. We will be praying about this, and invite you to pray about this with us, and intend to inform St. Andrews and Christ the King of our decision on September 17.

Please pray for both churches. For God's will to be done. For God to guide my family faithfully in this. For God's kingdom to grow both in Stockton and in Coeur d'Alene.

You are welcome to reach out with questions, prayers, or encouragement. Please direct your questions about this process to me, and encouragement and prayers to Miriam and our kids.
