Hello 2022 (or as some have jokingly called it, 2020-too)! As we enter into a new year, COVID is still looming large in the minds of some of us, while others may be feeling like it is a thorn in their sides! Still, many, if not most of us, never want to hear the word "pandemic" again. But with a new year, we are one year closer to Jesus' Second Coming. Three hundred sixty-five days closer to Jesus coming back! And that truth is something that we can rejoice in!

In fact, Jesus coming back isn't only something that we can rejoice in, it's the core hope of our Christian faith! That when Christ returns, He will raise us up on the Last Day, and we will be with Him forever. There we will live with our Lord, together with the saints and even the angels, praising God and living in a world without sin. What joy, peace, love, and absolute life we will live!



It is precisely this truth that Saint Paul encourages the church at Thessalonica with. The Christians there believed that their loved ones who had died in the faith had somehow forfeited any hope that was once theirs in the Second Coming of Christ. Saint Paul's response to this is one word: Resurrection!

Saint Paul writes, "But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with Him those who have fallen asleep" (1 Thessalonians 4:13-14).

As we began the new year this past month, we entered into a new sermon series that focuses on resurrection and the gifts that God gives us through it. Not only has Christ risen from the dead, but we will be risen as well! Christ's resurrection isn't only some past event that we remember; it is a future event that we look forward to as well. That phrase "Jesus died and rose again" reveals what will happen to those who belong to Christ. We will rise, we will have hope, we will live forever. And all of this is done "through Jesus," as Saint Paul continues to emphasize.

And so as we enter into a new year, difficulties—and maybe even death—may be looming large in your life. Or perhaps you are clinging to the joys that you're currently rejoicing in. Either way, whatever you are feeling, good or bad, one thing is certain: We are one year closer. In fact, every day we are one day closer to Christ's return. This is our hope! This is our faith! This is our joy! That when Christ returns, our entire world will be changed: Sin, death, and the devil will be no more, and we will live in the glory of God forever.

That is why Saint Paul ends 1 Thessalonians 4 with one simple command: "Therefore, encourage one another with these words." Encourage one another, lift each other up in the promised hope of the resurrection. Why? Because with each new year come troubles unforeseen. Trials so crushing that they may in fact flatten you. Death could be right around the corner...but what of it? We have Christ and He has us! We are His and He is ours! And in Christ, the promise of the resurrection isn't wishful thinking—it is the reality that we will all experience soon enough.

Blessed 2022, and may you know that the resurrection is yours, and your sins are forgiven!

Newday Preschool provides the best care and learning possible in a safe and nurturing environment where each child has the opportunity to develop a positive self-image, as well as to grow spiritually, socially, emotionally, academically, and physically. Our staff consists of qualified, dedicated Christians who provide love and understanding to each individual child.

We offer Monday-Friday, Monday/Wednesday/Friday, and Tuesday/Thursday schedules for 2- to 5-year olds. We have options for full day (7:30am-5:30pm), half day (9am-11:45am), early drop-off, lunch bunch, and extended care.

Classes are filled on a first-come-first-served basis. Registration fees (\$175/child) are due upon receipt of application and are non-refundable (no exceptions).





Family Promise



What is this?

"Families come to us in crisis; we help them rebuild their lives with new skills and ongoing support." Family Promise (FP) is a ministry that helps local families address the root causes of family homelessness.

How does it work?

Families who have recently become homeless can apply to FP and go through a vetting process. Families accepted into the program receive holistic assistance in trying to regain stability through emergency shelter and meals, job and finance training, and transportation.

Why is St. Andrews partnering with Family Promise?

Our mission statement is "Inspiring our community to live out the hope found in Christ." We are called to act in faith, knowing we're loved and forgiven, and share God's

compassion with others. This is a fantastic opportunity to do just that.

What exactly is St. Andrews doing?

At the beginning of 2019, we committed to being one of San Joaquin County's "host congregations" for Family Promise's ministry. Now, after a slow organizational start-up—made even slower by the pandemic—FP is finally looking at beginning to host families starting in late March of 2022.

Here at St. Andrews, we will house and feed about four families for one week, four times a year. Our duties will include providing dinner and breakfast, socializing in the evening with the families, and having two people stay overnight each night.

At 7:00am each day, the families will be transported to the Family Promise day facility where they'll shower and have classes. They'll return to St. Andrews around 5:30pm, and the cycle repeats for one week (Sunday evening to Sunday morning of the following week).

How can I help during hosting week?

- Bring one or more meals!
- Plan some crafts or games and play with the kids for a couple hours one evening!
- Eat dinner with the families and share God's love!
- Spend a night at St. Andrews!

Please pray about helping with this ministry. Contact Pastor Brian (pastorbrian@stalc.org) if you would like to get involved, as he is not only our Family Promise contact, but he wants to help develop leaders at St. Andrews who are interested in spreading the Gospel and loving people in a very specific way!
