Acrophobia: fear of heights. Arachnophobia: fear of spiders. Cynophobia: fear of dogs (something I suffer from). Hemophobia: fear of blood. There are plenty of things you and I are afraid of. Whatever it may be, deep down we're all afraid of something. And fear can take a lot of forms. There's the "fight or flight" response people often have when faced with terror. Sometimes fear can cause anger and violence to well up inside of us. Fear can paralyze. It can lead to immobility in the face of something that threatens to end our lives.

Today, I feel as if St. Andrews isn't immobilized or paralyzed by fear, but I do feel that anxiety is all around. We have had to say goodbye to a senior pastor whom Jesus worked through in miraculous ways these past 18 years. And that can make us feel like there is a huge hole in our congregation. And this, maybe quite naturally, can lead to feelings of anxiety. Feelings that look to the future

with a sense of dread, and even a sense of fear. And although I am tempted to quote the oft-mentioned verses from Matthew 6:34 and Philippians 4:5-7, what I have been pondering these past few weeks is a portion of God's Word found somewhere else.

As time marches on, Jesus continues to work through you and through me here at St. Andrews. His promises remain for us and for all those we encounter in our daily lives. In that sense, nothing has changed. **(continued next page)**

(continued from first page) And so, what I have been praying on is Ephesians 2:19-22:

"So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit."

Christ is our Cornerstone. On Him alone do we rest and stand. And He will not be moved! Jesus has promised to never leave us or forsake us, and He has also proclaimed that He is our Lord. After all, we profess this on Sundays when we confess the Apostles' Creed and when we occasionally quote the Small Catechism. In short, Christ is the Lord of the Church. He is still the Savior and the One True Shepherd of St. Andrews Lutheran Church. And this is why we rest on Him. It is why He is our Cornerstone. For without Christ, we would be truly fearful, anxious, and worried.

But we are in Him, and He is in us. So we have nothing to fear! We rest on Christ and center ourselves on Him. He is who we share with others. He is what we preach. As St. Paul puts it, "But we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men" (1 Corinthians 1:23-25).

Let us go boldly, in His name, into the future.


