The battle against sin, death, and hell were for you.

The victory over the grave was for you.

The forgiveness of sin, life abundant, and life everlasting are for you.

I'm glad so many of you have taken on this forgiveness challenge. I'm really glad that forgiveness is not a challenge to God. May you rejoice and grow in that forgiveness each day.

Holy Week




Palm Sunday: April 10, 8:30-9:30am (Traditional) and 10:45-11:45am (Contemporary). The service starts with waving palm branches in joy and then weaves Scripture and song together as we hear the Gospel story of Jesus' sacrifice for us.

Maundy Thursday: April 14, 12-1pm and 7-8pm. We remember Jesus' last meal with His disciples and the establishing of Holy Communion. *First Communion at 7pm for kids who have completed our Stone 5 course.*

Good Friday: April 15, 12-1pm and 7-8pm. Walk with us through the account of Jesus' death and burial as we grieve our sin and His suffering. *The 7pm service is a Tenebrae service, in which a candle is extinguished after each reading. The service ends in darkness.*

Easter Sunday



Easter Outdoor Sunrise Service: April 17, 6-7am. He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Join us in the courtyard to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ as the sun rises. Bring a blanket! *Holy Communion will be celebrated*.

Easter Indoor Worship: April 17, 8:30-9:30am (hymns with organ and instruments) and 10:45-11:45am (contemporary songs with band). Rejoice! Our Lord is risen!






Gathering in Groups


