What does the term "discipleship" mean to you? Growing up in church and then even going to college to study theology at an LCMS university, the word "disciple" or "discipleship" always puzzled me. Like I was standing outside of a people group, hearing their lingo but not understanding what it meant. And you might feel the same way. Or...you might not.

There are plenty of us who feel fine when asked about discipleship. After all, being a disciple of Jesus simply means to follow Him. Or to put it in a more Gospelcentered, Jesus-focused way, being a disciple is being forgiven and known by Jesus. But there are still others of us who may feel a bit uneasy when the topic of discipleship comes up. And why is that? Why is disciple-

ship a seemingly touchy topic for some in the Christian world?

Well, I think that it's because when we hear "discipleship," sometimes we think about all the things we aren't doing for God—failed opportunities to tell others about Christ, failing to walk alongside others in the faith. And to be fair, this response is normal. (continued next page)

(continued from first page) But if discipleship means we are a part of the Body of Christ, there's no reason why we shouldn't also focus on our identity when we're feeling called to disciple someone.

Jesus tells the disciples in Mathew 28: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:18-20). We all know these verses, and the church even labeled them "The Great Commission." It's from these words of Jesus where we get our dual understanding of what it means to be a disciple. A disciple is one who is claimed by Christ, and a disciple is also one who goes and makes disciples, baptizing and teaching. One aspect of our lives as disciples is activity; the other identity. One is responding to Christ's commands; the other, listening to His words of forgiveness, life, and salvation—and believing in them.

As we enter into a new season here at St. Andrews with our church going through *The Discipleship Journey*, my prayer is that we continue to reflect on our duality as a disciple of Jesus. Yes, we are called to go and make disciples. Called to teach, to love, to care for those in our lives who are outside of the faith. But that call comes from who we are: Beloved children of God, forgiven by Jesus, cared for in every way. I pray that you never felt like I did as a college freshman, wondering what the heck it meant to be a disciple of Jesus. "What's a disciple, and beyond that, what's discipleship even mean?!?"

Christ has promised to work through His people, even as He says in John 15: "Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you...I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:3-5). And because He has promised to work through you, be confident in your role as a disciple. Christ is yours! You are His disciple! He is working through you to accomplish much for His Kingdom.


Multiplying Our Mission

2; 4; 8; 16; 32; 64; 128; 256; 512; 1,024; 2,048; 4,096; 8,192; 16,384; 32,768; 65,536; 131,072; 262,144; 524,288; 1,048,576

What do the above numbers represent? Well, let's say you helped someone come to faith in Jesus and taught them how to help someone else do the same this year. Then next year, you both did that again, so now there are four followers of Jesus. The third year, everyone does the same. The fourth year, you'll have eight people guiding eight more people into a walk with Jesus.

What if that kept going for 20 years, uninterrupted? There would be more than a million people following Jesus because you started praying for and helping one person each year come to know, love, and follow Jesus...and helped them do the same. Now maybe my pessimistic side says that 100% success is simply not possible, realistic, or something to plan on. What about 90%? 80%? 50% 10%? Let's say that if after 20 years you have a 99% "fail" rate, how many would be following Jesus?



1% of 1,000,000 = 10,000

How about a 99.9% "fail" rate? .1% of 1,000,000 = 1,000

How about a 99.99% "fail" rate?

.01% of 1,000,000 = 100

I'm not sure about you, but for most American Christians I know, helping 100 people come to faith and following Jesus in the next twenty years is probably considerably more than occurred during the last twenty years. It's an odd way of putting it, but I'd be thrilled if most Christians I know had a 99.99% fail rate at helping people come to know and follow Jesus—in fact, I wouldn't call that failure at all! I'm tempted to even begin praying that that is the case, as it would

create far more kingdom growth than I have observed over the last twenty years. So a .01% success rate at helping people come to know and follow Jesus is all it takes to see greater kingdom growth than most of us have seen in our lifetimes.

Perhaps my math isn't perfect, but I believe you might begin to see that the growth of God's kingdom may not seem as remarkable as we often think. And even if you did things perfectly in the scenario above, you personally would have only needed to help twenty people (one a year) come to know and follow Jesus.

I'd be thrilled if most Christians I know had a 99.99% fail rate.

This paradigm is not church as we know it, which spends great deals of time, money, and energy trying to get people to come to worship, programs, projects, etc. It's based more on Jesus' command to "go and make disciples," a far freer and more adaptive paradigm than we have made it to be. (See Pastor Brian's cover article for more about this passage.)

This fall, St. Andrews is taking a step in the direction of "go and make disciples." We'll still have plenty of things happening in the "come and see" paradigm, but we'll begin orienting ourselves more and more to the "go and make" side. The first step is going through *The Discipleship Journey* together, getting acquainted with how to share the basics of the faith with someone else.

So join us in praying that God does something amazing among us. That some of our patterns change, that some of our habits change, that some of our perspectives shift according to His plans and purpose for our lives, our church, and our community. Get into a group that walks through *The Discipleship Journey* (the easiest might be between services on Sunday mornings), and join with us in praying for the fullness of God's kingdom to come throughout these coming eight weeks.
