It has been an honor to be your pastor. You took a chance, at God's leading, on an inexperienced young man and demonstrated the patience and endurance to let me grow. You were forgiving when I failed you, encouraging when we did some wonderful work together, and grateful when I helped you. I hope I have helped you learn a fraction of what I have learned from you.

I did some quick math and figure I've preached about 1,000 different sermons between Sundays, holidays, funerals, weddings, and other occasions. Since many of those were done more than once, I think I've preached for about 600 hours while I've been here (it's probably felt like a

lot longer for you). When I consider my prep time, I spent the equivalent of more than two years of work weeks preparing for those messages. The manuscripts (if I had them all) would fill at least ten 300-page books.

Why so much time and effort doing that? Because I hoped to convey God's Word to you. The Word that convicts, the Word that transforms, the Word that works faith and brings about forgiveness, life, and salvation. The Word that IS truth.

- Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. Psalm 119:105
- For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.
 Hebrews 4:12
- For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith." Romans 1:16-17
- "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth." John 17:17
- Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. — Ephesians 5:24-26
- ...and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. 2 Timothy 2:2
- "so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it." Isaiah 55:11
- And so many more.

I hope you didn't just accept what I said any given week at face value. Like the Bereans in Acts 17, I hope you tested everything, examining the Word for yourself, allowing it to guide, convict, train, equip, and transform you. My prayer is that word shared by me and by your past and future pastors and teachers will not return to God empty, but will accomplish wonderful works He has prepared in advance for you to do.


school again in the future. Oil and perfume make the heart glad, and the sweetness of a friend comes from his earnest counsel. Proverbs 27:9


Operation Christmas Child
