In 1 Peter 4:7, St. Peter tells us a shocking thing: "The end of all things is at hand." This is something that has been true ever since Christ ascended into heaven and promised that He is coming soon. Yet because we oftentimes do not act as if Christ is coming like a thief in the night, St. Peter continues, "therefore be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers. Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. Show hospitality to one another without grumbling." It's an odd thing that after addressing the fact that Christ is coming soon, St. Peter points us not towards doing some amazing thing for God, but rather he points us towards those around us.

Luther was quoted as saying that our vocations are "masks of God." He also said, "God doesn't need your works; your neighbor does."

On the surface, when we are interacting with others or when they are interacting with us, we only see people. A mother, a father, a mechanic, a waiter, a pastor. But underneath these earthly appearances, God is using these people to minister to those around us, and even to ourselves. For those who have been given faith by God, we can see this reality firsthand. For those who do not have faith, they simply go about life oblivious to God's gracious hand and the work that He does for them. **[continued on next page]**

**[continued from first page]** St. Peter echoes this point. He says, "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen." Here at St. Andrews it is often said that we are God's family. And that is because we are! Within this blessed truth, God uses each one of us in our vocations to care for one another.

So, when we give our time in service to God's people, God is the one at work within us. When we care for others as a child, a parent, a co-worker, a citizen, God is the one who is caring for others through us. In this sense, because we have been crucified with Christ we no longer live, but it is Christ who lives in us. Jesus wears us like a mask—a disguise even—so that He may be of service to those He loves. Thus, Christ is working in our lives and it is no longer us who work, who care, who love. It is Christ, working and caring and loving through us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

As we embark on the summer of 2024, I know that there will be times of rest and relaxation. Yet, as we continue to be fed by Christ daily, and especially on Sunday morning, remember that Christ is at work within you, even if you don't feel like it. You have been baptized, and you are God's child. Have no fear, and do not doubt: For Christ, the Risen Lord, is our God. He is the one who will continue to use us to do His great work of proclaiming His truth to the world. Amen. Come soon, Lord Jesus. Amen.

### **From Our Interim Admin Pastor**

St. Paul wrote a powerful exhortation to a young pastor named Timothy to bring encouragement no matter what he had to endure. Paul wrote these words while he was in prison: "I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day" (2 Timothy 1:12 KJV). An old gospel hymn used that verse as a launchpad to encourage Christians. The tune and words are flooding my memory as I type. Each stanza expresses our lack of knowledge about the mysterious work of God. (1) I do not know why God would love and redeem me. (2) I do not know how God's Word can bring saving faith and peace to me. (3) I do not understand how the Holy Spirit can work in me. (4) I do not know what "good or ill" I will encounter in this life. (5) I do not know when Jesus is coming back.

The refrain after each stanza reminds us that even if we cannot fully know the mysteries of our faith, we are fully known by God and that God is true to his Word. "But I know Whom I have believed, and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I've committed unto Him against that day."

As we move through these preparations for calling a senior pastor, I thank the Lord for your church and the faithful pastors and members who have kept alive the Gospel message on this property. You and I have the faith today because of faithful people who were dedicated to Word and Sacrament ministry. In the "Know Your Church" report, many of you responded positively to these two statements: "I know what I believe, and why I believe it" and "I have grown as a Christian since being at this church."

May the Holy Spirit continue to lead you in the process of identifying and calling the right person as the next senior pastor. Please participate in the meeting and roundtable discussion on **May 19** as we move closer in identifying the character traits and gifts you want to see in the new senior pastor. 
## **Upcoming Vote**


## Rahab Comfort Dog

## Youth






