



RE: WRITTEN ON BEHALF OF THOSE WHO SHARE OUR RELIGIOUS EXEMPTION

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is written on behalf of those devout Christians who believe the Word of God forbids us to accept certain things and entities into our bodies, as our bodies are the living temple of the Holy Spirit. As such, to ask us to violate the Commandments of our God would force us to choose between so-called human science and our undying faith in the written commands of God. When the governments of men do not ask us to violate these deeply held truths, we gladly yield and obey.

With various mandates being passed down, I would caution you to consider a time in the future when most of these claims will be brought before the courts. When the heat of the moment gives way to the founding principles of the Constitution and the legal precedence of religious exemption proves to be a viable objection, many companies will have made the mistake, while under the pressure of the moment, of not giving any serious regard for religious objections nor the future consequences thereof. The religious objection is the right of all Americans.

Here are a few verses of scripture for our claim of religious objection:  
Leviticus 11:1-47; Deuteronomy 14:1-29; Genesis 7:2; Romans 12:1

Whereas we do not know the long-term consequences of the Covid Vaccine and whereas we do not understand its long-term effects on our bodies (God's Holy Temple), we are forced to error on the side of spiritual caution and refuse to harm our temples in honor of God's Holy Word.

The 1st Amendment of the Constitution has protected these exact claims before the Supreme Court. Illinois state legislatures have even passed laws to ensure the protection of religious objections/ exemptions. Passed with nearly unanimous consent, the Illinois "Health Care Right of Conscience Act" states clearly that it is "unlawful" to discriminate because of a person's "conscientious refusal" to receive health care services "contrary to his or her conscience." Illinois law defines one's conscience as "a sincerely held set of moral convictions arising from belief in and relation to God, or which, though not so derived, arises from a place in the life of its possessor parallel to that filled by God among adherents to religious faiths."

As Christians, we strive to be at peace with all men and to obey all laws and mandates from our elected government. However, we cannot do so in violation of God's Holy Laws, of which the protection of my body is one of those spiritual laws that supersedes all manmade laws in our religious conscience.
