“He went out and made His way as usual to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed Him. When He reached the place, He told them, “Pray that you may not enter into temptation.” Then He withdrew from them about a stone’s throw, knelt down, and began to pray, “Father, if You are willing, take this cup away from Me—nevertheless, not My will, but Yours, be done.” [Then an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. Being in anguish, He prayed more fervently, and His sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground.] When He got up from prayer and came to the disciples, He found them sleeping, exhausted from their grief. “Why are you sleeping?” He asked them. “Get up and pray, so that you won’t enter into temptation.”” (Luke 22:39-46, HCSB)

We will never know the anguish of our Lord while he prayed in the garden that night. Our minds can never comprehend the full, raw, emotional, physical, and spiritual struggle he endured hours before he died one of the most gruesome and humiliating deaths of that time. He knew what was about to take place. He knew it was going to be painful and humiliating. The burden of all man’s sin was pressing upon him. His anguish was so intense that he bled as he prayed.

The disciples had been asked to pray. It was late and they were tired. Have you ever tried to pray when your body is fatigued? It usually doesn’t take long for pray, or whatever attempt we make at it, to fade away to sleep. They had no idea what their master was enduring, just a few yards away in the dead of night. They certainly did not know what was about to transpire. Within a few hours their lives world would be very different. They would never be the same again. They would experience fear like they had never known it. In time, their fear would give way to faith. Their slain Lord rose from the grave. That experience would propel them to do some incredible things in Jesus’ name.

The challenge remains the same for all of Christ’s followers, “***Why are you sleeping?” He asked them. “Get up and pray, so that you won’t enter into temptation.”*** Let us pray that we will not give into the temptation to run away, to quit, to remain silent, to be afraid when the enemy attacks, or to use any other excuse to abandon the work that Christ has called and empowered us to do.

No. Make sure you are here because you know that God has given us an opportunity to share the gospel. And, sometimes, sharing the gospel can be challenging and sometimes it can cause us to step outside of our comfort zones.






