SUMMER WEDNESDAY NIGHT SCHEDULE


There will be no meal served during the summer months. Services will begin at 6 pm.

"For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they will keep you from being useless or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. The person who lacks these things is blind and shortsighted and has forgotten the cleansing from his past sins." (2 Peter 1:8-9, HCSB)

This passage has become a theme for our summer series ***The Heart of the Home***. To be honest, I believe that everyone wants to improve. I don't know of anyone that wants to deteriorate. Athletes are constantly training and testing their own limits. Some folks diet, or make adjustments to eat healthier. Some people discipline themselves financially in order to get out of debt.

Some of them are examples of what it looks like when we add the qualities Peter mentions. Some of them are examples of what it looks like when we forget. And, believe it or not, there are a few that did both. There were periods in which they grew spiritually and then there are periods in which the same person seemingly forgot. Can we relate to that? Sure, we can.

An "English as a Second Language (ESL)" Ministry

Here's the problem. The children are learning to speak English, but in many cases the parents are not. It is not that they are unwilling, but there is nothing being offered to help them learn. I do believe that if you come to our great country, you need to learn the language. Life is much easier for them, and us, that way.

through the Women's Missionary Union (WMU) that will provide training to teach an ESL class.

I talked with Cindy Heimbach, the director of the ESL ministry. Here's what I found out:

You are not required to hold a teaching degree to teach an ESL class.

You are not required to be bilingual.

You do not need a translator.

We need 7-8 volunteers and she will come train us here.

There are people in need of ESL classes that we are not aware of.

I have talked to a few people personally. We have about 5 individuals that are willing to be trained. Would you pray about this and let me know if you are interested? We have internationals coming to us. Think of what God might do, if we were willing to trust Him in this.

Prayer for the NYC Mission Team, June 2-8

Our team will be leaving for New York City very soon. The Lord has provided the resources we need, and for that we must give thanks. Pray for our spiritual preparation. We will be encountering people in the community where Anchor Church will make its public launch around Easter 2021.

I've been amazed at how God has continued to provide for Brenton and Danielle Shelby in NYC. It's not that I had any doubts about their calling, or about God's ability to provide, but to actually see the hand of God at work putting all of the pieces together at just the right time has been incredible.

Brenton began a 1-year residency with Apostle's Church downtown. This was part of NAMB's recommendation and it has paid off. A core team of volunteers has been assembled, who are committed to work toward the launch of Anchor Church (this is the church Brenton & Danielle will plant). Mission teams, like ours, are going to assist the Shelby's in the work there. They plan to hold monthly worship services beginning in January 2021 and officially launch Easter 2021.

It takes time, and the Manhattan area is not easy to plant a church in. I heard this firsthand from the NAMB assessment folks. Brenton is on target, according to NAMB's estimation. And the progress of his work, the financing, the partnerships being formed, and the assembly of the core team, affirms that God is working there.

This is why it is so important for our team to be spiritually prepared. God will use this team; I am certain of that. We need to be mindful of the important role that we, and others, will play in the formation of Anchor Church in Manhattan. We will be participating in Narrative Mapping (using questionnaires to get info from locals), working in one of their city parks (building a network/New Yorkers are proud of their parks), serving food to homeless, working with a ministry that focuses on human trafficking, and other projects. I am confident of the team assembled and I am mostly looking forward to what God does through this effort.
