



# A Healed Man is Thankful

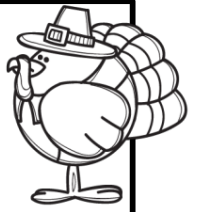
(Luke 17: 11-18)

One day Jesus was travelling through Samaria and Galilee. As He entered into the village, He met ten men who were sick. They had leprosy and were separated from all the other people. When the 10 lepers saw Jesus, they shouted to Jesus asking him to have mercy and heal them. Jesus wanted them to go into the church and speak with the priests, and thanks to Jesus, the lepers were healed from their disease. One of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God and fell down on *his* face at His feet, giving him thanks. Jesus answered him and said, “Were there not ten cleansed? But where *are* the other nine men?” Only one of the ten men that Jesus healed had returned to say thank you. Why did only one of the men come back to say “Thank You”? Jesus was shocked that only one man had come back, and he said unto him, “Arise, go thy way: thy faith hath made thee whole.” Not only had this man’s body been healed, but also Jesus cleansed his soul. This man stood out from the crowd because he recognized that he had received a blessing and responded with a spirit of thankfulness.

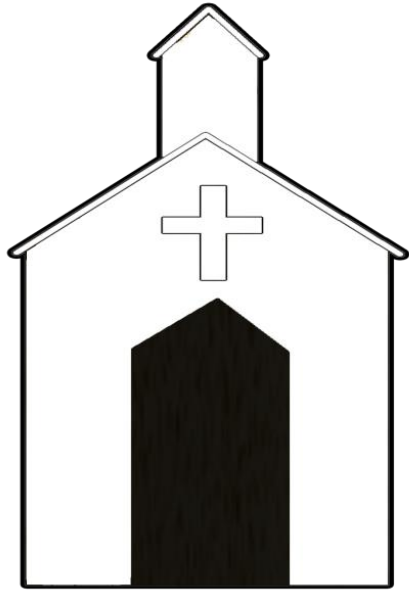


One man healed from leprosy returned to thank Jesus for the blessing. He fell down on his face at Jesus's feet, giving Him thanks. Luke 17: 11-18

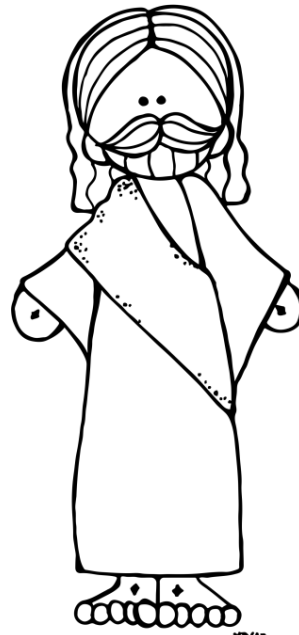

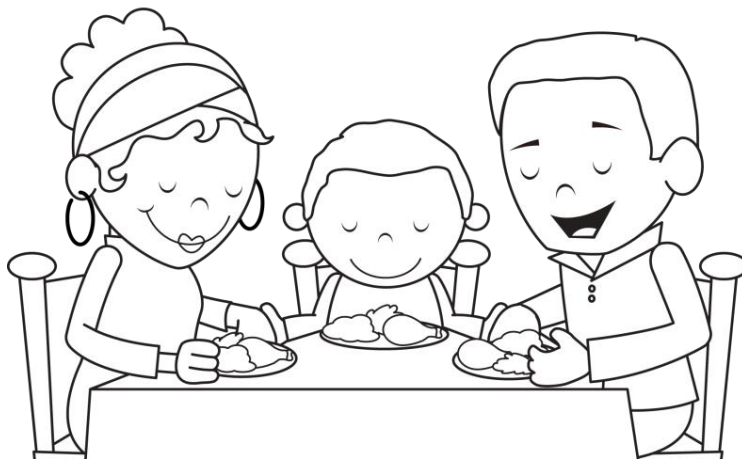

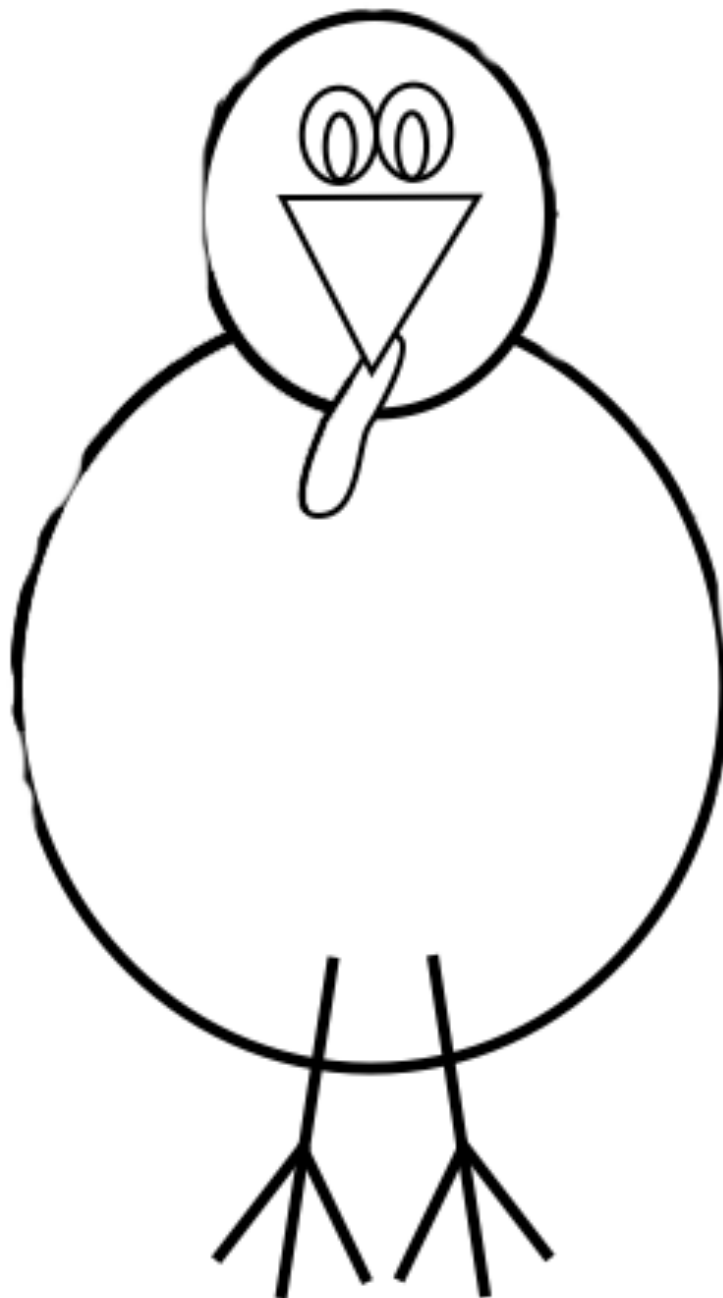
