# Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

# The Pillars of the Living Church Acts 2:42-47

Main Preaching Point: To be a sincere and growing follower of Christ, commit yourself to the biblical marks of the living church: learning the Word, caring for one another, worshipping the risen Christ, and bearing witness to the world.

- ➤ A Learning Community: Study
- ➤ A Caring Community: Fellowship
- ➤ A Worshipping Community: Praise
- ➤ A Missional Community: Evangelism

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Acts 2:42-47

Title: The Pillars of the Living Church

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

#### A Learning Community: Study

- 2. Is the Acts 2 church a solid pattern and example for the church in any generation? In what way(s).
- 3. Read Acts 2:42. Why was it the apostles' teaching that the early church committed themselves to? Was unique about them and their teaching? How was it connected to Christ?
  - ➤ According to the sermon what does the word "devoted" mean? How would you describe your commitment to

- continued growth and learning as a Christian disciple? What are your practices and devotional habits as it related to learning?
- Read Psalm 119:37. Discuss.

# A Caring Community: Fellowship

- 4. Read v.42-46. What does the word "fellowship" mean? What does it *not* mean? According to the sermon and that of Scripture what do believers share *in*? What is it that unites them? And what are believers to share *out*? That is, what and how are they to give in order to love and serve one another?
  - ➤ Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-7. Discuss the biblical principles around giving. And what are practical ways of showing generosity to our fellow Christians?

#### A Worshipping Community: Praise

- 5. Read v.46-47. What words and phrases capture the element of worship among these early believers? Why is corporate worship important? Why can't believers simply worship alone and dispense with public gatherings? Explain.
  - ➤ Read Hebrews 10:24-25. Why do attend worship? What are some of the biblical reasons and motivations that ought to drive believers to public worship? Discuss.

#### A Missional Community: Evangelism

- 6. Read v.46-47. How do these verses reveal the relationship of the church to the world? What is the church's calling as it relates to its external mission to the lost? How great of a priority ought this to be for the church?
- 7. How does Acts 2:42-47 point us to the person and work of Jesus Christ? Explain.
