

Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

Helplessness and a Longing for God's Justice: The Visions of the Horns and Blacksmiths Zechariah 1:18-21

Main Preaching Point: Though at times God leads his people into deep valley's in which they may feel helpless, He does so that they might be still and see his powerful hand of deliverance.

- > The Meaning of the Vision: Disrupted by national powers
- > The Significance of the Vision: God's judgment and salvation

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Zechariah 1:18-21

Title: Helplessness and a Longing for God's Justice: The Visions of the

Horns and Blacksmiths

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

The Meaning of the Vision: Disrupted by national powers

- 2. Read Zechariah 1:18-19. According to the sermon what do the horns represent? What effect have they had on God's people? Recall the larger context of Zechariah—what period of time is the prophet ministering?
 - ➤ How do the horns relate to Assyria and Babylon's impact on the northern and southern kingdoms? (see 2 Kings 17:6ff, and ch.25).

- 3. Read Zechariah 1:20-21. What likely do the craftsmen represent? What do they do to the horns? Explain.
 - Read Daniel 2:20-21. Though kings and nations act of their own will, how does the passage in Daniel provide insight as to God's involvement? How should this shape the Christian's view of national power? Discuss.
- 4. Though God ordains the authority and institution of nations and states, how does Zechariah 1:18-21 reveal the reality of power struggles among nations? And how does the passage prompt a longing for God's justice in the world?
- 5. Though God's people should seek for justice in the world (Micah 6:8), whose justice? How would you define 'justice'? What is the relationship between civil/social justice and that of one being just before God? What is the relationship between the two?

The Significance of the Vision: God's judgment and salvation

6.Helplessness—positioned for grace. According to the sermon how do those in Zechariah's day, as well as our own, see that the position of feeling helpless can often be the position in which God's grace may be experienced? Explain.

- o Read Exodus 14:10-14. Relate.
- 7. Unimaginable—opportunity for the miraculous. While God's people were in exile, under Babylonian rule, it would have been nearly impossible for them to believe that such a power could be overcome. How does the rise of the Persians and their issuing a decree for God's people to return to Jerusalem reveal that what appears at time unimaginable may be occasion for God to work supernaturally? Discuss.
- 8. Judgment—vengeance is God's. How does the gospel and a Christian worldview provide remedy to past and present injustices—on both a micro and macro level, that would otherwise never be put to right?
- 9. How does this passage in Zechariah point us forward to the person and work of Jesus Christ? Discuss.
