## Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

## Our True Home – The Promise of God's Presence: The Vision of a Man with a Measuring Line Zechariah 2:1-13

Main Preaching Point: Though God's people often see limits to His power and protection, and question his glorious presence, He has promised to be with his people as well as guard them—most clearly shown in the person and work of Jesus Christ.

- ➤ A Flourishing City: Populated and Protected (v.1-5)
- ➤ A Magnetic City: The Dwelling of God with Man (v.6-13)

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Zechariah 2:1-13

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

## A Flourishing City: Populated and Protected (v.1-5)

- 2. Read Zechariah 2:1-5. Consider the main components and events that give shape to this third vision. What is the young man setting out to do? Why? Relate this to ch.1:16. And what is the historical context that gives sense to what the young man is doing?
- 3. Read again v.3-4. Why is the angel sent to tell the young man that Jerusalem shall be inhabited without walls? What is the sense of this? What does it reveal about the priority of rebuilding the temple before that of the walls? Why would God's people be interested in first rebuilding the walls of the city? Discuss.

- ➤ To rebuild the temple without the security of walls means a certain vulnerability. Man often desires security and safety before that of faithfulness and courage. Discuss ways that believers (perhaps in any age) are challenged to live courageously for the Lord while being willing to sacrifice personal safety and security?
- 4. Read v.5. What does this passage reveal about the kind of relationship and provision the LORD is guaranteeing his people?
  - ➤ Discuss ways of applying the first five verses to the church today?

## A Magnetic City: The Dwelling of God with Man (v.6-13)

- 5. Read Zechariah 2:6-13. Who is the LORD (through Zechariah) communicating to? What is he calling them to do?
  - ➤ What does v.8 reveal about the value God places on his chosen people?
- 6. How does this passage stress the close and divine presence of God (see v.10)?
- 7. According to the sermon, how should Christians today think about the role of God's chosen city (and Temple) in the Old Testament? How is the city and temple a "type" of a greater city and temple to come? How does this relate to the coming of Jesus Christ and the church being his body? Read John 2:18-22 and 1 Peter 2:4-5.
