# Notes for the Preaching of God's Word God's Powerful Purposes in the Day of Small Things Zechariah 4:1-14

Main Preaching Point: God, in Jesus Christ, has provided his continual presence, powerful Spirit, and enduring Word, so that your life would not be overwhelmed by discouraging circumstances, but by joy in his person and work.

- > The Continual Brightness of God—light in dark times
- Resting on the Supply of God's Spirit—God's purposes in confusing times
- > Trust in the Word of the LORD—rejoicing in doubtful times

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups Text: Zechariah 4:1-14 Title: God's Powerful Purposes in the Day of Small Things **Questions:** 

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

The Continual Brightness of God—light in dark times

2. Consider the overall context of Zechariah and his ministry. When did he minister and what was the overall situation surrounding the covenant community? How does it relate to today?

3. Read Zechariah 4:1-3. What is the vision that Zechariah sees? The lampstand imagery points back to the time of the tabernacle and first temple (Exodus 25; 1 Ki.7). What does the lampstand represent? Why was this important for Zechariah's audience? How is it important for us?

- Read Psalm 27:1 and 2 Corinthians 4:6. What does the metaphor of light in Scripture represent?
- There are many thing to which people in our surrounding culture are looking to for meaning, hope, and life. How does the light/lampstand in Zechariah (and throughout Scripture) reveal something different?

Resting on the Supply of God's Spirit—God's purposes in confusing times

4. Read Zechariah 4:5-7. What is the message that this lampstand communicates? Who is Zerubbabel and what is his task as it pertains to this restoration period?

What does the 'great mountain' represent and what does it mean that it will become a plain?

5. The main message in these verses comes in those words: "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the LORD of hosts." If it is Spirit of God that is ultimately going to be the engine behind this rebuilding and restoration, what does it mean (provide examples) to try and rebuild "by might or power"? How might we apply this today? What are the ways that God's people will depend on might or power rather than God's Spirit? Discuss. See also Ephesians 3:16; 5:18; Gal.5:16,18,25.

### Trust in the Word of the LORD—rejoicing in doubtful times

6. Read Zechariah 4:8-10. What is the message coming through in these verses? How did their current situation and circumstances appear to be unimpressive? Apply this to the church today.

Discuss how God's work and ways may begin small but in the end be magnificent and glorious? How does this relate to God's Kingdom in Jesus Christ? Read Matthew 13:31-32. What might this teach us about following after Christ?
