Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

Destined for the Cross Luke 19:28-40

Main Preaching Point: As glorious Lord and humble King, Jesus calls his people into his wonderful redemptive story that they would know the end for which they were made—to know and worship Him.

- > Jesus' determination to save a people: fulfillment of a larger plan
- ➤ The believer's place in God's big picture: the privilege of being part of the story
- The King's humble coronation: the Lordship of Jesus

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Luke 19:28-40

Title: Destined for the Cross

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

Jesus' determination to save a people: fulfillment of a larger plan

- 2. Read Luke 19:28-40. Focus on v.28. According to the sermon how is this passage literarily significant, by way of structure? Read also Luke 9:51, 13:22, and 17:11.
 - ➤ What does 9:51 means when it says, "he set his face to go to Jerusalem"? The Greek word behind "set" means "firmly planted" or "steadfastly resolved." Jesus knew he would be "taken up" (returning to his heavenly Father), yet he steadfastly committed himself to pursue the cross. Reflect on John Calvin's comments: "He had to be moved by the

cruel and bitter death, the dreadful and horrifying torture which He knew hung over Him from the strict judgment of God...He cast off all care for Himself, devoted Himself to our salvation, and walked through the midst of terrors towards the death which He well knew was near at hand."

3. There are potentially many pursuits we may engage in throughout life—education, friendships, vocations, leisure activities—amidst all of those things how should Jesus' pursuit of the cross give primary shape to our life and faith? Explain. How might his pursuit of the cross give us relief from our pursuits?

The believer's place in God's big picture: the privilege of being part of the story

- 4. What roles do the disciples play in the triumphal entry story? Do they understand what is happening? Discuss.
- 5. How does the simple obedience of the two disciples provide an example for us? At times we don't understand God's providential ways or how his Kingdom is unfolding, yet how might a focus on obedience to God's clear commands enable us to play a part in God's grand story? Discuss.

The King's humble coronation: the Lordship of Jesus

6. Read v.37-40. What is the response of Jesus' disciples as he comes into Jerusalem? How does this reveal an important aspect of Jesus' identity? What does it mean that Jesus is King? What are the implications for living our lives after him? For the church of Christ?
