Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

A Living Hope 1 Peter 1:3-9

Main Preaching Point: If you are united to Christ, the risen Lord, live out your faith with sincere hope and deep joy knowing that you have a glorious inheritance that awaits and that the One who sustains and sanctifies you is greater than any earthly trial.

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: 1 Peter 1:3-9
Title: A Living Hope

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

The Sure Foundation of Hope

- 2. Read 1 Peter 1:3. According to the sermon (and text) who is Peter writing to? How did suffering and trials give shape to this community? Read 1 Peter 1:6, 2:18-20; 3:9, 13-17; 4:1-4. How does this relate to hope?
- 3. What is this "living hope" that Peter mentions? How would you define hope? How is it different than wishful thinking or believing in the high probability of something coming to pass?
 - ➤ According to v.3 what is the foundation of hope? Identify the three things.

- o What is God's mercy?
- What does it mean to be 'born again'? Read also John 3:3.
- How is the resurrection of Christ foundational for having hope? Read Romans 6:5. Consider & discuss the significance of being united to Christ in his death and in his resurrection.

The Future Experience of Hope

- 4. Read 1 Peter 1:3-4. Describe the future experience or reality of hope. To what does hope look? Describe the inheritance that is to come. According to the sermon, why is the inheritance described as "kept in heaven"?
- 5. What does it mean that the inheritance to come is characterized in the following ways:
 - > Never perishing
 - > Does not spoil
 - > Never fading
- 6. Read v.6-7. Peter explains that the purpose of trials is to test/prove faith, which he compares to that of gold refined by fire. What does the proven faith result in? What is the praise, glory, and honor referring to? How does it relate to our final salvation and inheritance? Discuss.

The Present Effect of Hope

- 7. Read 1 Peter 1:8-9. How does hope and God's sanctifying work through the presence of trials bring Peter to say, you "are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy"? How does hope lead to great joy?
 - ➤ In the face of life's sufferings and trials, as well as death itself, do you have hope? What is it based on? Are you trusting in Jesus Christ? Discuss.
