Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

The Builder of God's House Zechariah 6:9-15

Main Preaching Point: As your King and Priest Christ has accomplished a great redemption, and having promised to build his church, he calls you to make your life about his great mission.

- ▶ Crown and Branch: The One who Builds the Church
- > Temple: Those who are Called to Serve and Bless the Church

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups Text: Zechariah 6:9-15 Title: The Builder of God's House **Questions:**

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

Crown and Branch: The One who Builds the Church

2. Read Zechariah 6:9-15. Having finished the 8 visions in chapters 1-6, the LORD now calls Zechariah to carry out a sign-act. According to the sermon what is a sign-act? What is it that the LORD calls Zechariah to do in this act?

What does the act, including Zechariah's words to Joshua depict?

3. The sign-act communicates a message that points to "the Branch"—a figure that will come in royalty and kingship, taking his throne (v.13). Read Jeremiah 33:14-16. Discuss.

What two offices are mentioned in this passage? How does Jesus Christ fulfill both of these? Read 1 Peter 3:22 and Hebrews 4:14-16. Why is the office of Christ as King and Priest important for us? Explain.

4. Though this whole passage is a sign-act, and not actual restoration of Judea, why is this sign so important? How does it point to the gospel of Christ?

What is the gospel. It is spoken of in numerous places in the New Testament (e.g. Mark 1:14-15; Romans 1:1,9,15-16; Phil 1:7). In what way(s) is the degree of understanding and appropriation of the gospel to everyday life congruent with a life of flourishing? Is it? Explain.

Temple: Those who are Called to Serve and Bless the Church

5. Read Zechariah 6:12-15. What is a primary focus for the coming 'Branch' (king)? What is he going to do? Read Matthew 16:16-18.

6. Focus on v.15. What is a primary work that people will who associate with Christ the King? The church is God's temple (1 Cor.3:16-17). And He is building his church. Reflect on your own life in relation to the church of Jesus Christ? In what ways is the church to give shape to your identity as one of God's people?

What are the primary ways that God calls us to be a part of his body (church) and in what ways are we to serve and build the body? How is this an outworking of the gospel in one's life? Discuss.
