# Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

# What Does the LORD Require? Zechariah 7:1-14

Main Preaching Point: In response to his redeeming grace, the Lord calls his people to a God-centered devotion that is from the genuineness of the heart—shaped by a life of justice, mercy, and worship.

- ➤ The Question: Continue Fasting?
- The Answer: A Hard-hitting Response
  - o False Fasting: Self-serving empty ritual
  - o True Fasting: Lives of Justice, Mercy, and Worship

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Zechariah 7:1-14

Title: What Does the LORD Require?

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

# The Question: Continue Fasting?

2. Read Zechariah 7:1-3. What is significant about the time stamp in verse l—that is, "the fourth year of King Darius"? Read Zechariah 1:1. What year did God's word first come to Zechariah? The temple was completed in the 6<sup>th</sup> year of King Darius (see Ezra 6:15). This means that in the fourth year the temple construction is well underway. How does this relate to the question that comes in v.3? Discuss.

- 3. Read v.4-7. To their question, the LORD provides a four-fold response, running through chapter 7 & 8. In 7:4, 7:8, 8:1, and 8:18 we have the four initial responses that the LORD provides to the question that comes in 7:3. Focus on 7:4-7. What is behind the Lord's question: "when you fasted and mourned...these 70 years, was it for me that you fasted?" What was the lesson that the LORD was seeking to teach his people through the exile? Why were they exiled in the first place?
  - ➤ What is the danger of carrying out Christian practices and disciplines (e.g. prayer, fasting, meditation on God's Word, public worship, confession of sin, etc.) without cultivating and acknowledging one's heart and desires in the direction of the Lord? Discuss.

#### The Answer: A Hard-hitting Response

- 4. How does the Lord's response get to the heart of biblical Christianity? Does it? Explain. Think about the greatest commandment in Scripture—Deut. 6:5 & Matthew 22:34-38. "You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind." The greatest thing the Lord commands us to is not so much an action (though it certainly is manifested in actions), but a desire. He commands our desires. What does this reflect about human nature and what our God is ultimately after? Discuss.
- 5. Read v.8-10. How are these actions a demonstration of one's love for God? Why does the LORD care about these things and groups of people? How is the church in demonstrating kindness, mercy, and justice, a paradigm for the larger culture?
- 6. How does the larger passage in Zechariah point one to the Lord Jesus Christ and his gospel? Read Luke 4:16-21.
