
FLOWER CALENDAR



Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

From Fasts to Feasts Zechariah 8:1-23

Main Preaching Point: Yield to the Lord's word and draw near to his faith-community so that you will know his saving grace, abundant blessings, and be used to bring his gospel to the nations.

➤ A New City Saved by the LORD (v.1-8)

- ➢ A Flourishing City Sowing Peace (v.9-19)
- ➤ A Future City Sought by the Nations (v.20-23)

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups Text: Zechariah 8:1-23 Title: From Fasts to Feasts **Questions:**

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

A New City Saved by the LORD (v.1-8)

2. Read Zechariah 8:1-8. What characteristics define this picture of the restored city?

 What role does God's relationship to his people play in giving shape to the restored community? Explain.

3. What does this passage reveal about the character of God? Experiencing the blessing and favor of God seems to be dependent on God's presence and dwelling with man. How are believers to cultivate the presence of the Lord? What practices are you demonstrating and seeking to live out to know the dwelling of God in your life?

A Flourishing City Sowing Peace (v.9-19)

4. Read Zechariah 8:9-19. What characteristics define this picture of the restored city? How might this picture of flourishing be an encouragement for the people to be strong ("Let your hands be strong") and continue in their building efforts?

5. Focus on v.14-15. Given that the LORD brought disaster upon God's people in times past and is now visiting them with good and times of refreshing, how would you describe God's character? Is he immutable? How would you explain the consistency of God's actions, given that his actions at times are wrathful and at other times merciful? Discuss.

6. Given that God's promise of blessing and restoration is to the corporate body, how should individual believers think about the place and priority of the covenant community? In what way(s) can the high American values of individualism and consumerism effect the way individual believers view and relate to the corporate body? What potential dangers surface? Discuss.

A Future City Sought by the Nations (v.20-23)

7. Read v.20-23. How do the first two pictures (v.1-8 and v.9-19) point to and find the beginning of fulfillment in the New Testament church inaugurated by Christ? Explain.

8. How do v.20-23 also begin to find fulfillment in the early church, particularly in Pentecost? Read Acts 2:1-13 (and Peter's sermon following, in v.14-41).

9. How does the larger text of Zechariah 8 point to the gospel of the Lord Jesus?
