Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

The Shepherd Struck and a People Cleansed Zechariah 13:1-9

Main Preaching Point: Since the sacrificial work and suffering of Christ the good shepherd has accomplished a cleansing and redeeming work, call upon the name of God so that you would know his good and refining work in your life and faith.

- Cleansing from Sin—removing idolatry and renewing the land (v.1-6)
- ➤ Striking the Shepherd—a scattered yet saved flock (v.7-9)

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Zechariah 13:1-9

Title: The Shepherd Struck and a People Cleansed

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

Cleansing from Sin—removing idolatry and renewing the land (v.l-6)

- 2. Read Zechariah 13:1-6. First, focus on v.1. What does the fountain represent? Read Psalm 36:9 and Jeremiah 2:13. Discuss.
 - ➤ What does God intend to do for his people, according to verse !? Given all that the community in Zechariah's day has been through what does this reveal about the LORD's purposes and character?
- 3. In considering God's cleansing from sin, read 1 John 1:8-9. Here, as elsewhere in Scripture there is a strong emphasis on the assurance of

forgiveness through the saving work of God through Jesus Christ. The Christian is both *already* sanctified (Heb.10:10) and is still *being* sanctified. How should a Christian view themselves more—as *already* made holy? Or still *being made* holy? How do you tend to view yourself? Would you consider it a healthy view? Discuss.

- 4. Focus on Zechariah 13:2-6. How does the text shift from verse 1? Where does the cleansing spread to? How does this relate to the creation story and mandate?
 - ➤ Read Genesis 1:26-28 and 2:15. What does it mean that God called man to "subdue the earth" and to "work and keep the garden?" Is that still in play today? And how might that relate to God's work in the Zechariah context?

Striking the Shepherd—a scattered yet saved flock (v.7-9)

- 5. Read Zechariah 13:7-9. Focus on v.7. God's cleansing work comes through the striking of a shepherd. Who is the shepherd that is struck? Read Matthew 26:31 and Hebrews 13:20.
 - ➤ What is the context of Matthew 26:26-32? How is the blood of Jesus Christ the avenue of cleansing and forgiveness of sin? Explain.
- 6. Though the flock scatters, what does Zechariah 13:9 teach us about God's sanctifying work in his people?
