BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER




FLOWER CALENDAR



Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

Oh Come, Let Us Worship and Bow Down Psalm 95:1-11

Main Preaching Point: As those who know the LORD as Creator and Redeemer, cultivate delight in the greatness and glory of God that you might know the joy he intends.

Text: Psalm 95:1-11

Title: Oh Come, Let Us Worship and Bow Down

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

The Reasons for Worship

- 2. Read Psalm 95:1-5. What works of God does the Psalmist highlight? What do these works reveal about the person of the LORD? Why is it important?
 - ➤ In these first verses what is the reason the Psalmist gives for worshipping the LORD? What does it mean that God is 'great' (verse 3)? Read Romans 11:33-36. Reflect.
- 3. What is the tone in which the Psalmist invites people to make a joyful noise and worship the LORD? Is it with a sense of demand? Explain. Think of

Jesus' invitation in Matthew 11:25-30. How is Jesus' invitation unassuming, gentle? Discuss.

- 4. How is the Psalm calling people to be captivated by the LORD? Discuss John Ortberg's words: "For many of us the great danger is not that we will renounce our faith. It is that we will become so distracted and rushed and preoccupied that we will settle for a mediocre version of it. We will just skim our lives instead of actually living them."
- 5. Read Psalm 95:6-7. What should we make of the posture's mentioned—bowing down and kneeling? Are these significant? Explain.
- 6. What is the reason the Psalmist gives for worshipping the LORD in v.7? How should this shape the way we live and relate to the LORD? Discuss.

The Caution in Worship

- 7. Read v.7-11. According to the sermon how do these words draw the reader back to Exodus 17 and Numbers 14? What happened in those chapters?
 - ➤ Hebrews 3-4 provides what is likely the most thoroughly cited Old Testament text (Psalm 95) in the New Testament. You may read and examine that passage for yourself, but to summarize: the author of Hebrews, in exhorting professing believers to enter God's eternal rest, he draws upon Psalm 95, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion." He wants them to strive (Heb.4:11) after Christ and find their ultimate rest, justification, and continued growth in Him. Discuss ways that believers can help ensure that indeed they are resting in Christ?
- 8. How does Psalm 95 point us to the person and work of Christ, where we find our deep and eternal rest in the Lord? What things might be pulling you away from that rest? Reflect and meditate on Jesus' words in Matthew 11:25-30.
