Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Matthew 16:13-23

Title: The True Churchman

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

The Question—The Identity of Jesus

2. Read v.13-17. Since the Pharisees appear to demonstrate a blind enmity toward Jesus (see 16:1) and the general public understands Jesus to be John the Baptist, or one of the prophets (16:13-14), why is it unclear who Jesus is? Explain.

3. What is significant about Peter's confession?

- What does it mean that "flesh and blood has not revealed this to you but my Father who is in heaven?" (v.17). Why is this important? Is there any practical application to this?

- What does it mean that Jesus is "the Christ" and "the Son of the living God"? (v.16)

The Promise—The Church of Christ

4. Read v.18-20. What is the relationship between Jesus's identity and the church? Today many people profess to be believers in Christ but don't see a need for the church. How would you counsel them? Explain.

- Consider each word in Jesus's promise: "I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH". In what way(s) are each of those words important? Which word is impressed most upon your heart? Explain.

5. How should we understand the keys of the kingdom? And the authority to "bind" and "loose"?

The Work—Life through Death

6. Read v.21-23. Why does Peter take Jesus aside and rebuke him?

- Why is the death of Christ central to the gospel? How is the Christian's spiritual death a necessity for possessing life? Read Galatians 2:20 and Romans 6:1-14 and relate.
