Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

The Wisdom that Brings Us Shalom

Proverbs 3:1-12

Main Preaching Point: So that your life may flourish with the peace/shalom of God, commit yourself to the wise path of Christ-like humility, gratitude, and submission.

- Peace through Humility (v.1,3,5-6,7)
- Peace through Gratitude (v.9-10)
- Peace through Submission (v.11-12)

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: Proverbs 3:1-12

Title: The Wisdom that Brings Us Shalom

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

Peace through Humility (v.5-8)

2. Read v.2. What is peace (i.e. shalom)? According to the sermon (or outline) what are three ways this peace/shalom is manifest in the life of God's people? How are they counter-cultural? Consider humility, gratitude, and submission. In what way(s) does the sin nature and culture express the opposite? Explain.

3. What is meant by "trusting in the LORD" and how is it different than mere ascent to a set of propositional truths? What does it have to do with the idea of 'leaning'? Discuss.

- In the sermon I mention "peace-substitutes". Define that term. How might financial security, control, materialism, be

serving as substitutes for biblical shalom? Give other examples and discuss.

Peace through Gratitude (v.9-10)

4. Read v.9-10. These describe a person who expresses gratitude in a particular way? How so? What does it mean to honor the LORD with one's firstfruits? How might that be applied today?

- Read Malachi 3:6-10. Discuss.

5. While the above verses call for a people to be full of gratitude to the LORD, how does our culture reflect an attitude of entitlement? Can that creep into the life of a believer or church? Discuss.

Peace through Submission (v.11-12)

6. Read v.11-12. What is the LORD's discipline? How does it relate to the concept of discipling? Read Hebrews 12:5-11. How does receiving God's hand of discipline cause a life of shalom?

- How does God's discipline communicate his sincere love? In what way(s) has God been discipling (i.e. shaping, correcting, teaching, etc.) you lately? Explain.
