Notes for the Preaching of God's Word

The Day of the Lord 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Main Preaching Point: Though many people will see great and sudden destruction on the day of the Lord, do not worry like those in the darkness, but rather live as children of the light destined for salvation

- The suddenness of Christ's coming (v.1-2)
 - o The day of the Lord (v.2)
 - Three metaphors: a thief, an invasion, and birth pains (v.2-3)
- Inescapable wrath for those in darkness (v.3)
- Assurance in living as children of the light (v.4-10)
- Encourage one another (v.ll)

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 Title: The Day of the Lord

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

The suddenness of Christ's coming (v.1-2)

- 2. Why does Paul say, "you have no need to have anything written to you" regarding the day of the Lord? Did they know when that day would come? Explain. Read Mark 13:32.
 - What is "the day of the Lord"? Read Isaiah 13:6-9 and Joel 2:1-2. What will happen on that day for those outside of Christ? What will happen to those who are in Christ? Read 2 Thessalonians 1:6-10. Should the believer look forward to this day? Explain.

➤ What metaphors does Paul use to describe the day of the Lord and its suddenness? How are these helpful?

Inescapable wrath for those in darkness (v.3)

3. Read v.3. According to the sermon, what are two dangers to avoid in considering the return of the Lord? In what ways can anxiety or complacency define one's view toward the Lord's return or the end of one's life?

Assurance in living as children of the light (v.4-10)

- 4. Read v.4-10. How does Christ drive home assurance for the believer in these verses?
 - ➤ While Paul calls the believer to live with soberness, love, hope, and faith, what is the grounds of his assurance? Is it the believer's own holy living? How is holy living grounded in the believer's identity as one united to Christ? Hint: it seems to me to be grounded in the words, "For you are all children of light" (v.5).
- 5. Focus on v.9-10. How can Paul speak with such confidence and assurance about the future destiny of these professing believers? How should this shape the way we live and our countenance?

Encourage one another (v.11)

6. Read v.11. As Paul mentioned earlier in chapter 4:18, his purpose is very practical—"encourage one another..." In what way(s) can you seek to encourage others in the body of Christ?
