Notes for the Preaching of God's Word Wisdom from Above James 3:13-18

Main Preaching Point: Through Christ draw from the wisdom that comes from above, so that you may live the good life in your relationships and experience a harvest of righteousness.

Questions for Individuals, families, or small groups

Text: James 3:13-18

Title: Wisdom from Above

Questions:

1. What was most important or applicable in today's preaching? Can you summarize the main message?

Two Wisdoms

- 2. James has already introduced the theme of wisdom. Read James 1:5ff. What is biblical wisdom? How is it to be distinguished from the idea of knowledge? Explain.
- 3. Read v.15 and v.17. Compare the two wisdoms that James addresses. How are they different as it relates to their:
 - A. Origin
 - B. Characteristics
 - C. Results
- 4. Can a non-believer demonstrate the appearance of godliness (love, gentleness, kindness, etc.)? And can a believer act in devilish ways?

Recall that Satan masquerades as an angel of light (2 Cor.11:14) and that Peter was rebuked by Jesus with the words, "get behind me, Satan!" (Mt.16:23). Since the unregenerate can act with signs of outward godliness, and believers can act in unspiritual ways, how does James get beneath the surface? See v.14 and the language of the heart.

The deeper issue is that of the heart and what source it draws from. Envy, jealousy, and selfish ambition must be purged from the heart. Discuss/consider the different ways that people can feel or express jealousy, envy, and selfish ambition in the life of the church? How does the gospel of Christ remedy selfish ambition? Explain.

Relationships

- 5. According to the overall passage, what does envy, jealousy, and selfish ambition lead to?
- 6. Think about the uniqueness of the church as a community. How are the relationships to be different than any other organization? What sets the church apart from membership in various social clubs or being a member at gym or philanthropic organization? They all have some purpose, but focus on the relationships—how are they different, and how should they be lived out differently? Discuss.

The Path of Peace

7. According to v.18, what does one's life produce who is drawing from the wisdom of God? According to the sermon, what is meant by "a harvest (or fruit) of righteousness"? How do James' overall words point us to the person and work of Christ? In what ways can you contribute to the unity and peace of the body of Christ?
