# Why Write Fiction?

- Huge market: incredibly lucrative, big money to be made
- Rabid buyers
- Loyal following
- Career as writer
- Many opportunities
- “Writer lifestyle”
- Lifetime royalties
- NO RESEARCH NEEDED
- Total control over the story
- Anonymity (in case your book flops...) with pen names

# What is Fiction?

- Fiction is a story
- Fiction is a story with well-defined themes, characters, plots,
- Fiction is a fantasy world where anything and everything can happen
- Fiction is a safe place to live out a story or a fantasy and still feel safe
- Fiction is a world that you can return to at your own leisure, where you can press 'pause' and 'resume' at will

# Why is Fiction so Popular?

- “Not boring”!
- Escape from reality
- Projection of your inner self
- Cure for boredom
- Inspiration
- “How it should be”
- Romantic
- Surreal
- Think about “campfire stories”

# Types of Fiction

- Flash Fiction
  - < 1,000 words
- Short stories
  - 1,000 – 7,500 words
- Novella
  - 20,000 – 50,000 words
- Novel
  - 50,000 – 120,000 words
- Epic novel and Sequels
  - 120,000 words+

# Basic Elements of Fiction

- Plot
  - A series of events with conflict and resolution
- Character
  - Drivers of your story
- Setting
  - Place; holds together the story; makes the story more believable
- Theme
  - Binds all elements together
- Point of View
  - Determines overall flexibility of story

# Underlying Idea: Story Telling

- Tell a story from start to finish
- Think about talking with a friend on the phone about something that happened today at work
- Length of story doesn't matter; it's the INTEREST of the listener (or reader)!
- Should have a "suitable" ending... happy is best
- Image: bards in the ancient days...
- Make good use of literary words and techniques (advanced; do not worry about this at first)

# “Ladder” Theory

- To get really good at fiction writing, start with shorter stories and make your way up
- Do Flash Fiction (x3)
- Do Short Stories (x3)
- Do Novellas (x3)
- Do Novels (infinity)

# #1 Rule as Fiction Author

- Keep the customer happy!
- They will constantly ask for updates
- Some customers have waited for years just for another volume in the series...
- Once a loyal customer, always a loyal customer (but with minor complaints)

# Best way to create a story

- Start with a character
  - You can use a real-life person as an archetype
- Base the entire story around this character's life
- Imagine the character going through his life
- Imagine the character going through trouble
- Imagine the character getting out of trouble
- Imagine the character interacting with other characters
- Let the character solve his/her problems
- All you have to do is observe and write it down!
