Minister: Lift up your hearts!


People: We lift them up to the Lord!

Order of Worship for the Home – The Week of August 8, 2010

Praise

Call to Worship (*everyone together*)

Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let Your glory be over all the earth!

“To God Be the Glory” (*sing or say these words together*)

To God be the glory, great things He has done! So loved He the world that He gave us His Son, Who yielded His life an atonement for sin, and opened the life-gate that we may go in.

Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, let the earth hear His voice! Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, let the people rejoice! O come to the Father through Jesus the Son, and give Him the glory, great things He has done!

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Proverbs 24.30-34 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Younger Children (*may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times*)

1. Have you ever waited too long to do something that needed to be done? What was it, and what happened?
2. What does it mean to neglect something? What are we capable of neglecting?
3. What’s the harm to what we neglect? What’s the harm to us when we neglect?
4. What must we do when we recognize that we’re guilty of neglect? What does God promise to those who recognize their sin, including the sin of neglect (cf. I John 1:9)?

Questions for older children

5. Why would a neglect of our relationship to the Lord be ultimately responsible for our neglect of other important things? Or, to put it positively, why would a closeness with God keep us from the sin of neglect?
6. The Lord warns us about neglect, not only of things, but also of people. His kindness is to warn us ahead of time so that we don’t neglect. But what is our hope if we’ve already brought harm through our neglect?
7. If our neglect can end up stealing good from us, and making us poorer in a number of ways, why is there comfort in Jesus’ words: “Blessed are the poor in spirit” — that is blessed are those who realize how needy they are for the forgiving grace of God?

Scripture Memory for August (*memorize these verses of Scripture this month*)

Proverbs 3.5-7:

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths. Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord, and turn away from evil.

Prayer

Prayer (*saying together*)

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for Thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory forever. Amen.
