

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What are the five things Peter says to put away in 1 Peter 2.1?
Talk about each of these to make sure you understand.
2. What does Peter tell us to long for in 1 Peter 2.2?
3. What is the pure spiritual milk?
4. How can we taste the Lord's goodness?

Questions for older children

1. What do the five things in 1 Peter 2.1 have in common?
2. When have you tasted that the Lord is good?
3. Why is Jesus called a living stone? How are we like Him?
