

The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples,

- ³⁶ and he looked at Jesus as He walked by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!"
- ³⁷ The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.
- ³⁸ Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them, "What are you seeking?" And they said to Him, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are You staying?"
- ³⁹ He said to them, "Come and you will see." So they came and saw where He was staying, and they stayed with Him that day, for it was about the tenth hour.
- ⁴⁰ One of the two who heard John speak and followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.

- ⁴⁶ Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see."
- ⁴⁷ Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward Him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!"
- ⁴⁸ Nathanael said to Him, "How do You know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you."
- ⁴⁹ Nathanael answered Him, "Rabbi, You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!"



John 1.35-51 "What Are You Seeking?"

Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	Take a minute and read over the text. How many times do you see a reference to "vision, sight and seeing"? Now, take a few more minutes and go all the way back to the beginning of chapter 1 and do the same. Why is this theme important?
2.	As you look over the entirety of John 1, what are the first words of the Lord Jesus that John records? What strikes you about these words of the Lord Jesus? Do they have a place in your life today?
3.	Unpack the flow of events between these early disciples being called. What stands out to you in their conversations?
4.	What is the promise Jesus speaks to Nathaniel?
5.	What does the calling they received from Christ have to do with our own union with Christ?
