



Polar Bears Vs. Monroeville

In game three of the 2019 Polar Bear Football Season, the Bears rallied against the Monroeville Eagles for the Homecoming 2019 game.

In the first quarter, the Bears scored 8 points, when Clay Teschner received an 80 yard pass from Spencer Michel with Brycetyn Hedden on the run. In the second quarter, with 2 seconds left, Daltyn Wiedbrauk had a 4 yard reception in the endzone from Spencer Michel. Brycetyn Hedden had a 2 point conversion, and the quarter ended 22-12.

In the third quarter, the Bears added another 6 points to the board and 7 in the fourth. The Polar Bears won 35- 12. At the end of the game, the Bears had 126 rushing yards, and a total of491 yards of offense on 81 plays.
