






















Facilities Update

Over the last few weeks, Margaretta administration has had meetings and conference calls to decide how to proceed with the building of a new school.

A telephone conference was held on Friday, November 1, 2019 with Baker Tilly Municipal Advisor, Bricker Eckler Law Firm and the school district. The discussion centered on the potential Nexus pipeline revenue projection and estimates from Sandusky and Erie County tax collection dollars.

Also discussed were items pertaining to the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP), school district debt limitations, current interest rates, bond rating and the requirement for the Margaretta Board of Education to approve a 'Resolution Lease Purchase' agreement at the November meeting.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 12th in Columbus at 11:00 A.M.

The November 12th meeting was postponed due to a snow day and was re-scheduled for Tuesday, November 19, 2019. At this meeting, the district submitted our student enrollment projections to the OFCC. The OFCC will review the projections and approve. Also, the OFCC, upon approval of the student enrollment projections, will then forward a formal 'ELPP Agreement' to our Board of Education to formalize our facility project with OFCC. The 'ELPP Agreement' may be forwarded as soon as December. After the 'ELPP' is signed by both parties, the district can then hire Fanning-Howey as the lead architect.
