Man's best friend! What would we do without them? With their extravagant ability to calm people down, no matter what mood they are in, dogs are truly the best.

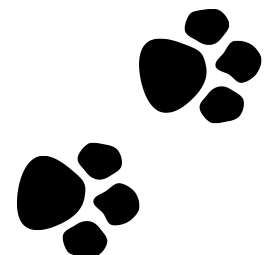

Sectionals, Districts, and State

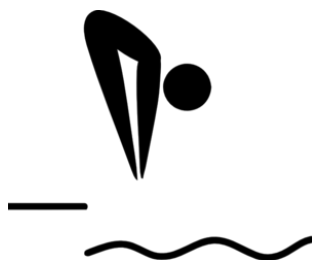
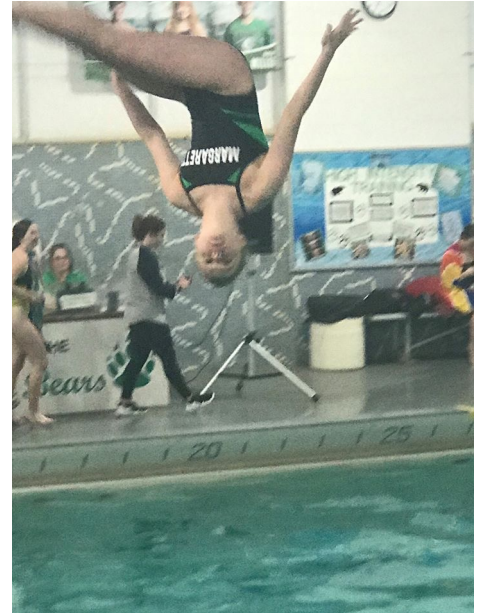
Margaretta made its way through Sectionals with outstanding results. The girls 200 Medley, 200 Free Relay and 400 Relay broke their records.

At the State Swimming & Dive competition, Kenna Stimmel finished 14th overall and Anna Gasser finished 20th. Great Job Girls!

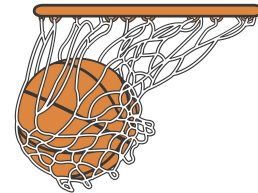
At the State swimming finals, Lily Green finished 23rd in the girls 50 meter freestyle. Congratulations Lily!

Game Recaps:

January 24, 2020 - Victory over Edison in Sandusky Bay Conference. "We're just happy to get out of here with a win," said Polar Bears coach Steve Keller Jr. "We knew Edison is really scrappy. It was a physical game, we were able to make the plays we needed to get it done." Bears made it out to 17-9 lead at the half. "The biggest thing we had to do was we had to grind," Keller said. "We were able to make just enough plays against their 2-3 zone." Bears went 14 for 16 at the free throw line. Brycetynn Hedden went 8 for 8, with a high 16 point game. Jake Leibacher contributed with going 4 for 4 and 12 points.

January 30, 2020 - Huge win over state ranked St. Paul! 63-58 "I am really blessed and pleased to coach this group of young men," Margaretta coach Steve Keller said. "We came to really battle and really to compete on every possession. We made a lot of plays." The Polar Bears continued to answer every time St. Paul cut the lead to one possession or a single point.

February 4, 2020 - SBC crossover victory over Lakota, 67-42. Jake Leibacher lead the team with 14 points. Following him was Daltyn Weidbrauk with 10, Brycetynn Hedden, Spencer Michel and Ben Palomo all with 9, and Nathan Scaffer with 2.

February 8, 2020 - Sandusky Bay Conference loss against Port Clinton. The Redskins kept our Polar Bears from scoring the first 2:39 of the game. Daltyn Wiedbrauk hit a shot bringing the score up to 43 with 2:46 remaining. It was a "dog fight" until the final minute of the game when one of the Redskins players, Adam Thorbahn, made a bucket and they simply hung on. However, Port Clinton milked their two point lead and ended up with the victory after a long, hard fought battle. Leibacher finished with 16 points and seven rebounds, Brycetynn Hedden and Dayltn Weidbrack both had 10 points and also a team high of eight rebounds. "They flat out, plain and simple, guarded us all night. We struggled to make the extra pass and we didn't get others involved. I love our guys and I'm blessed to coach them, but we have to get better from here because they did a really nice job of taking away some of our better offensive weapons and we struggled to adjust," Coach Steve Keller Jr. commented.

February 14, 2020 - Loss vs. Oak Harbor, 49-79. "They're a well balanced team. They have a nice inside presence with the Dowlings, and Blake Booker can extend the offense. I just told our guys that this is the toughest stretch of the season with Oak Harbor, St. Mary and Willard. They have to battle and fight to get better," Coach Steve Keller Jr said. Spencer Michel had 13 points to lead the Polar Bears, Brycetynn Hedden followed with 10 points.

February 15, 2020 - Loss vs. St.Mary's 51-62.

February 21, 2020 - Non conference loss VS. Willard 37-53

February 25, 2020 - The Polar Bears opened up with a 15-0 run VS. Seneca East, defeating adversity to become sectional champs. Jake Leibacher led Margaretta in points with 14. "We played some very good teams in that four game stretch. Truthfully, our guys had a mindset tonight of it being the second season. I think that stretch we had has made us better," Coach Steve Keller said. This has been the ninth straight season in which Margaretta Boys have won at least one tournament game. "We have been blessed. Last year was the first time in school history that we have won three straight sectional titles. We have 32 minutes on Friday to win a fourth straight." - Keller. The Polar Bears used tough defense against the Tigers. "We have only had one player play here, but traditionally, we play well here," Keller added. "We came out and played well early. We had some open looks, but you have to make them." Margaretta improves to 12-11 and advances to face second seeded Western Reserve.
