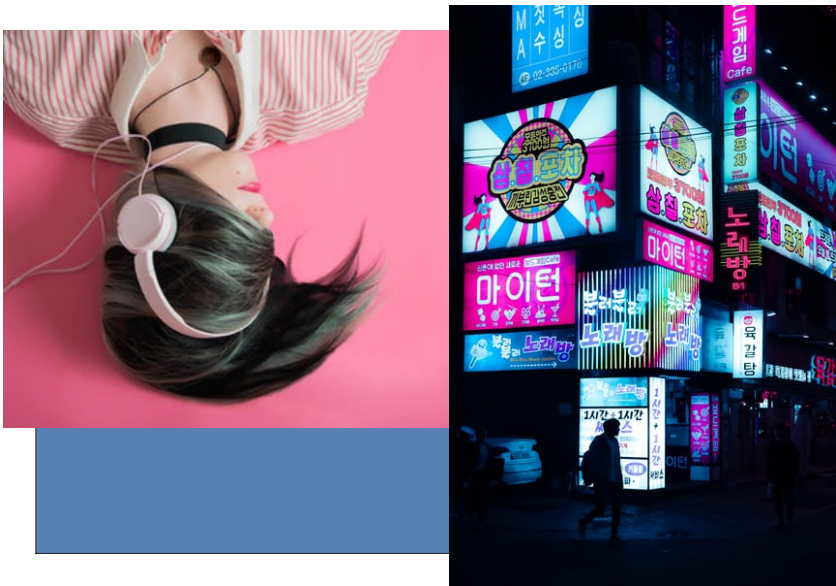

In eliminations:

We were picked by the number 5 alliance.

The Amazon rainforest is one of them. The atmosphere is currently holding about 415 parts per million, but with the current state of the forest there is an estimate that 38 parts per million has been added. “2.2 million-square mile rainforest in the Amazon is nearing a tipping point, at which large fragmented portions of the rainforest could transform into an entirely different, drier ecosystem, leading to the acceleration of climate change,” reports The Washington Post.
