U.S. President Donald Trump has not only changed the landscape of politics, he continuously spews and encourages racist aggression fueling evil acts of violence by white nationalists

"Words matter," said former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg during an interview on *Face the Nation*. "The public reads, watches, listens" to what their leaders say and that changes their behavior," he added. "People look to their leaders for guidance, and to say

it doesn't have an effect is wrong."

Democratic presidential candidate Beto O'Rourke called Trump a racist and said his words can be connected to the mass shooting in El Paso, Texas that left 20 people dead and more than two dozen injured.

When Trump told four members of Congress to "go back" to the countries to which they came, the remark was a racist taunt writes Adam Serwer author of *"Trump Tells America What Kind of Nationalist He Is"* published in *The Atlantic*. Rashida Tlaib, Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, Ayanna Pressley, and Ilhan Omar are American citizens.

According to Serwer, Trump is stating his ideological belief that American citizenship is fundamentally racial, that only white people can truly be citizens, and that people of color, immigrants in particular, are only conditional Americans. This is a cornerstone of white nationalism, writes Serwer.

Trump's usage of divisive identity politics has sparked a tremendous amount of anger, frustration and fear of which direction Trump is taking America. Americans today have never seen such cruelty against humanity by its own government. Too many Americans

AROUND THE WORLD

Republic of Zimbabwe

Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa negotiated a multi-billion dollar deal with Russian President Vladimir Putin to develop new mining operations for prospecting explorations and appraisals of Zimbabwe's Mineral Deposits.

The agreement ensures a significant contribution to government programs which includes Russia investing in oil and gas, Russia has been carving out a niche in Africa by shoring up strongmen in unstable but potentially rich States. Mnangagwa objective is to secure a long-term loan to help modernize Zimbabwe. They will sign the deal in October during the Russia-Africa Summit.

Beijing, China

Despite pressure from activist China parliament will not allow same-sex marriage. Marriage between a man and a woman will remain China's legal position. Zang Tiewei, spokesperson for parliament's legal affairs commission said the rule suits China's cultural traditions. Despite the growing awareness of LGBT issues in China there are no laws against same-sex relations.

Venezuela

U.S. Navy Admiral Craig Fuller said they are ready to deploy to Venezuela to implement political decisions to encircle President Maduro. In response, Diosdado Cabello, the first vice president of the PSUV said the gringo marines might enter Venezuela, the problem is how they are going to leave Venezuela."

In the news: The Emmett Till Commission has a new historical marker memorializing Emmett Till who was murdered in 1955 at the age of 14 was falsely accused of wolf-whistling at a white woman in a country store of Money, Mississippi. The monument sits on the the Tallahatchie River where Till's tortured and mutilated body was found. The commemorative marker has been vandalized with bullet holes, spray paint, and acid four times since it was first placed at the site in 2007. The murder of Emmett Till is regarded as one of the key events the led to the Civil Rights Movement.

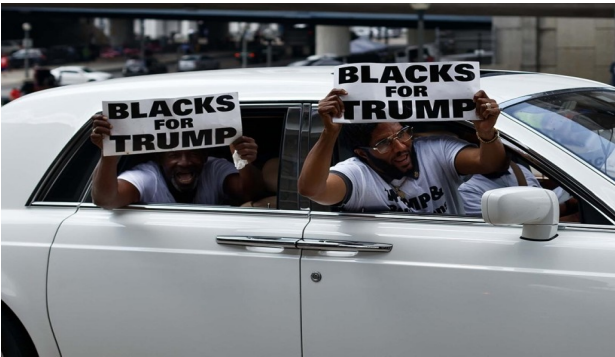

In the darkest hours of the struggle a revolutionary arises

Hear ye! Hear ye! Hear ye! I come before you not to speak the word of the gospel, and not to offend the public but to awaken ones consciousness in an era of critical change.

There is a growing rebellion in America, a rise in combative words, and a hardening of class difference all magnified in real time.

When 49ers quarterback Colin Kaepernick on September 1, 2016 opted to kneel during the U.S national anthem at his final preseason game, it was because he says, he could not bring himself to stand up and show pride in a flag for a country that oppresses people of color.

Almost immediately, it took me back to my childhood black history lectures at home, where I learned about unity, equality, justice for all and "Black Power." Yes, Kaepernick made a bold statement, but defiance for a cause has happened before, different place, different time.

Fifty years ago, at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City, Olympic sprinters Tommie Smith and John Carlos, raised black power fists as the "The Star Spangled Banner " played, and it scared the cramp out of white folks, the day after, they were expelled.

Fear has fractured American society. This honest examination of history is such an accurate depiction of paranoid fear of a potential black militant movement.

In view of Kaepernick's defiant stand, the nation has become less tolerate of citizen activism, but choosing to protest is not a violation of any state law, therefore, we can not allow the voices of citizens to be muted. Sociologist Robert Blauner said in his book, Racial Oppression in America, distinctiveness among ethnic minorities is placed in color "whites have distorted images of black power" and most are frightened.

It's been nearly four years since President Barack Obama completed his second term presidency, as it stands now, progress has left the building. President Obama soothed America's problems in an attempt to better American culture. We're not going back

Contaminated water continues to plague small town

Benton Harbor residents deeply concerned about water quality water and its potential health effects

Benton Harbor - "Save our children now," it is what Ed Pickney, a Benton Harbor resident said to the Facebook community.

Pickney says the water is contaminated and the Mayor refuses to tell people the water is undrinkable. According to the Associate Press lead at or above 15 parts per billion has been found in about 50 of the 320 water testing kits that the city has received.

Benton Harbor is not the only city in Michigan with elevated lead levels Hamtramck exceeded the EPA action level for lead in drinking waster last year. Benton

Cheers, Ms. Morrison and Thank you for giving voice to black literature

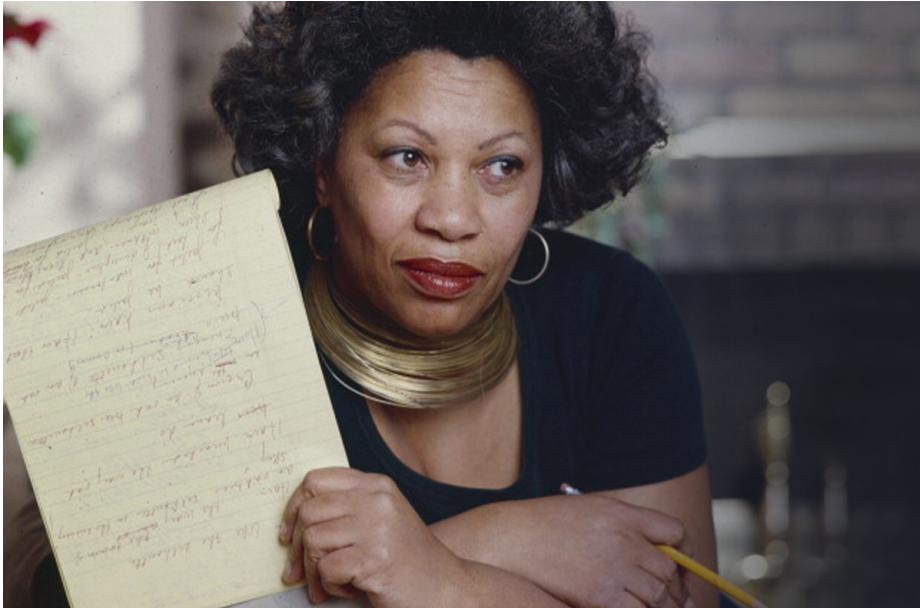

Toni Morrison's greatness as a literary writer derives from her frequent reading as a child. It was her parents who instilled in her self awareness and what her blackness means to the world.

Credited for bringing black literature into mainstream America, Morrison was a force, highlighting the black experience she gave voice to black literature. Her unique use of language incorporates different styles to help the reader connect to the content and its emotion.

Nearly 40 years old when her first novel "The Bluest Eye," was published, Morrison won the Pulitzer Prize in 1988 for "Beloved" and became the first black woman to receive the Nobel Prize in Literature. "Toni Morrison has done for the American novel what

Shakespeare did for theater, she is that important, she is that influential," said Carla Kaplan, Northeastern University Davis Distinguished Professor of American Literature.

In 2012 President Barack Obama awarded Morrison the nation's highest civilian honor, *The Presidential Freedom* award, recognizing her as one of the nation's most distinguished storytellers and for "nursing of souls and strengthening the character of the union."

On May 28, 1993 twenty-six scholars established the Toni Morrison Society. The Toni Morrison Society became the 41st author society of the American Literature Association and the fourth dedicated to an African American author. **TCP**

Democratic Congresswoman Rashida Tlaib made headline news when she used the F-word to harshly criticize President Donald Trump by saying, "Impeach the Mother-F."

Tlaib represents Michigan's 13th Congressional District and one of the largest Arab American communities in the United States.

Call her what you want, she is one of the most outspoken voices in America's political system. Detroit-born Tlaib is the first Palestinian American elected to Congress. However, there is community controversy in Detroit, despite fighting on the side of social and economic justice Congresswoman Tlaib is also driven by the oppression of Palestinians.

In an on-line article titled, "Rep. Rashida Tlaib's Black Problem" published in Detroit Deadline Greg Bowens a contributor to the publication claims Tlaib's congressional privilege has a snag. He writes, "...some blacks in her district wonder if she went off to Washington to focus more on the fight for Palestinian rights and immigration," rather than giving her attention to Detroit. Tlaib is pushing the boundaries,



to show historically there is commonality between Palestinians and African Americans. In an interview with *Jacobin*, a democratic socialist magazine Tlaib compares segregation in the United States to her Palestinian ancestors saying, "Just like we look at the struggle for black Americans for true equality and access to opportunity to thrive. . . all of that is why I say, "Free Palestine" that Palestinians deserve human rights."

Michael R. Fischbach writes in his book, "Black Power and Palestine." Black Americans' connections to the Middle East conflict, and the ways it affected them have been largely overlooked. With this being said, Congresswoman Tlaib knows the parallels of oppression between African Americans and Palestinians. The truth is

she is working hard for her district, but she is also focused on Palestinian rights. Perhaps, Tlaib's American activism will become a protest staple for the forgotten African-Palestinians who are dehumanized on a daily basis for being Palestinian and for being black. Since the Israeli occupation of the West Bank countless human rights violations have been committed against them.

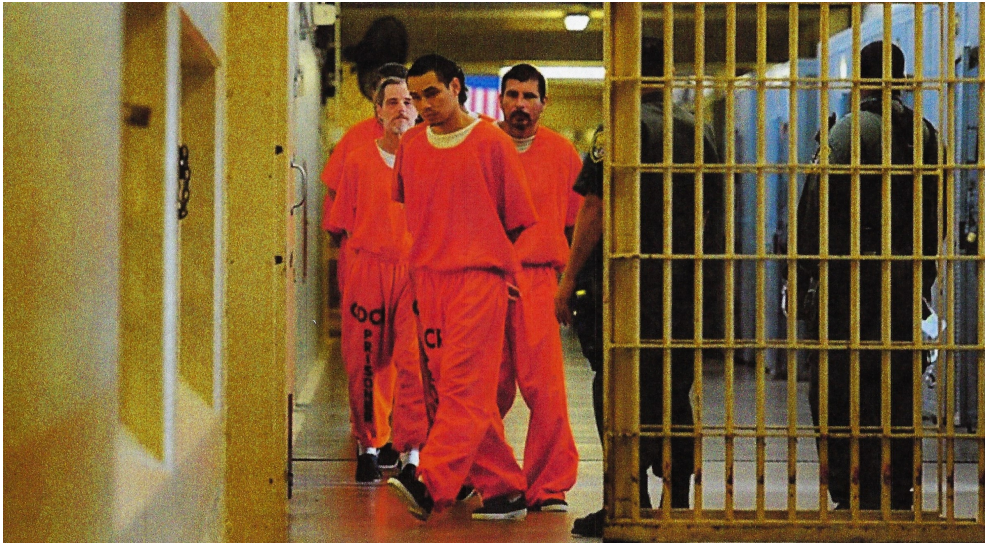

Managing mental illness in jails and prisons

The mental health crisis in America's prison system is an enormous national issue. Although statistics are notoriously poor, a conservative estimate suggests the alarming growth in the number of mentally ill individuals behind bars is nearly half of America's incarcerated population.

According to the United States Government Accountability Office research conducted in 2016 by its agency, Service Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services

Administration (SAMHSA) about 10.4 million adults in the United States suffer from conditions such as, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, major depression

and severe post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The concern is many of these individuals have shifted from the mental health system right into the criminal justice system which is severely under resourced in providing care to these individuals.

Jails and prisons are becoming known as the nation's largest psychiatric facility and are failing prisoners who need mental health treatment. Dr. Richard Jackson, founder and owner of the NeuroBehavioral Medicine

Group in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan describes schizophrenic types on the on-line program *MD Peer Exchange*, he said it is not easy to screen for severe mental illness, schizophrenia is a disorder of thought where patients have hallucinations and delusions which is the classic presentation of schizophrenia. Schizoaffective disorder has that plus either depressive disorder or bipolar disorder in addition to their psychotic symptoms, said Jackson.

A 2009 Human Rights Watch report titled, *III Equipped: US Prisons and Offenders with Mental Illness*, described inmates with mental illness as often punished for their symptoms. As a result, the report notes prisoners with mental illness are victimized and often have histories of disciplinary actions.

In *Estelle vs Gamble* (1976) the Supreme Court clearly determined that the Eighth Amendment requires prison officials provide a system of access to adequate medical care, which includes mental health care.

It is believed that the best alternative is community mental health treatment, but unfortunately there is no data available on costs associated with keeping people with severe mental illnesses in the corrections system.

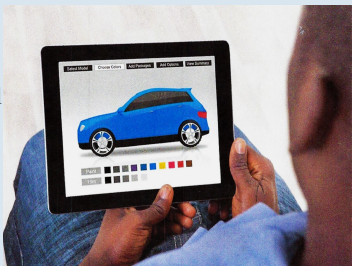

On-line retail to become the Preferred form of vehicle purchasing among private buyers

On-line sales are expected to gross 1 million in 2020 and grow to more than 6 million by 2025, finds Frost & Sullivan

Santa Clara, Calif. /PRNewswire/ - The on-line vehicle retail model is disrupting the traditional dealership model by enabling original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) to quickly introduce their products to the market while keeping costs low. In 2018, more than 618,000 new vehicles were sold on-line globally, nearly double the unit sales in 2017. On-line sales are expected to cross 1 million in 2020 and grow to more than 6 million by 2025. It is expected to become the preferred form of vehicle purchasing among private buyers, but fleet and corporate buyers will continue to favor the traditional retail format. "The popularity of the eCommerce model among the younger audience and the success of Tesla's on-line strategy is likely encourage other automakers to explore on-line retail beyond just pilots," said Isaac Abraham, Senior Consultant, Automotive Retail & Business Strategy. It also benchmarks various OEM initiatives in the segments of passenger cars and light trucks. It studies the different types of methods employed to sell vehicles on-line as well as evolution of the on-line vehicle sales markets by 2025. "Alibaba is expected to be the frontrunner in providing eCommerce solutions in China and is partnering with entrants to maximize its reach in the region," noted Abraham. The execution of Jamal Khashoggi Arab government given free rein to stifle Freedom of the Press

Jamal Khashoggi was one of Saudi Arabia's most prominent journalist and a known critic of Saudi Arabia's government. On October 2, 2018 he walked into the consulate in Istanbul, Turkey and was executed.

Khashoggi's death sparked global attention in part because of his close ties to the Saudi royal family. It is reported that Khashoggi told friends and colleagues that "freedom of speech under Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman was shrinking and he feared for his safety."

Saudi Arabia is one of the most censored countries in the world. There is no freedom of the press. Repressive nations have created a climate so oppressive journalist live in constant fear of arrest.

The Committee to Protect Journalist found more than half of the journalist imprisoned globally are charged with anti-state crimes, and the International Federation of Journalists (IFJ) reports at

least 95 journalists were killed in 2018. Violence has become an intensified persecution against journalists. When Khashoggi left his country exiling to the United States he wrote in his Washington Post column,, ". . .I can speak when so many cannot, I want you to know that Saudi Arabia has not always been as it is now. We Saudis deserve better." Khashoggi urged the crown prince to end violence in Yemen and restore dignity to Islam. Within twelve months he was murdered.

underestimate their power as citizens, and think the government has too much control in their lives. An article published in Gallup, "Government: The Most Important Issues Facing 2020 Candidates" by Frank Newport reveals Americans are worried about government having too much power but a significant segment of the population generally feels that government should provide more services. According to Newport, research showed 49 percent of Americans agree that the federal government represented "an immediate threat to the rights and freedoms of ordinary citizens."

The point is, citizens must fight for the future of America. Ask yourself, "What can I do?" Do not over look your power as a citizen.

Heather Heyer an activist who campaigned against hate became a symbol of civil rights when she was killed in 2017 after a neo-Nazi plowed into a crowd in Charlottesville, Virginia. Heyer was protesting against the "Unite the Right" rally, a group of white nationalists there to protest the proposed removal of General Robert E. Lee's statue that sits in Emancipation Park in Charlottesville.

After Heyer's death President Trump shocked many by failing to acknowledge white supremacy as wrong, instead he said there were "very fine people on both sides" giving white nationalists more leverage for violence.

Trump is politically reshaping the United States, perhaps, lessons of government can be learned from literary essayist Henry David Thoreau. He composed an essay that considered the rights and duties of individuals in relation to government. Thoreau's lecture "*Resistance to Civil*

Government is an anti-war, anti-slavery manual for social protest against any form of political injustice, it begins with the well-known motto, " that government is best which governs least." One would think Thoreau's words could stand as his epitaph.

In this Trump era the government is so toxic, the Southern Poverty Law Center SPLC) said "2018 is the year white nationalist drew blood." The killing of Heyer elevated violent extremism perpetrated by white nationalists. According to the *Washington Post*, in western Germany, Trump was celebrated after he said, "Our country is FULL!" to Mexican migrants attempting to cross into the

United States. They praised him as a "realistic man who has the courage to speak the truth," historians compared Trump's language to Adolph Hitler. In fact, it was John Connolly a historian of modern Europe at the University of California at Berkley who admitted, "The echoes do indeed remind one of the Nazi period, unfortunately." It is unfortunate because groups like these believe the white race is superior to all other races. These people are violent and are committing deadly crimes at an alarming rate using guns and assault weapons, showing no signs of letting up. According to SPLC white nationalist seek to return to an America that predates the implementation of the Civil

Rights Act of 1964 and the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965, ending non-white immigration is an urgent priority; fearing whites in the U.S. are on the verge of a "white-genocide."

Hate is on the rise, and the idea of the extinction of white people is a myth driven by a psychological panic to scare people so that the nationalist agenda can be justified and pushed forward.

Journalist Charles Blow of the New York Times defines the term "white extinction anxiety" as the fear that white people will be stripped of their race-based privilege and become the minority.

The central political tenet of a racist is people have the right to choose their sovereignty without interference based on the respect of equal rights.

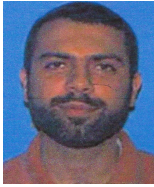

Here are snippets of his open discussion with Robert Satloff. Kushner talks about U.S. initiatives for the Israeli-Palestinian peace plan aimed to improve the standard of living for Palestinians and Israelis.

Satloff: So, let's begin with what you're proposing. Will it be a plan, a vision, a framework, a proposal?

Kushner: ". . .when I was on the campaign, all the experts were saying, well you have the Sunnis and the Shias and that's the big divide with the Arabs.

But what I see in the region is the big divide now is leaders who are trying to empower there people and create more opportunity for them to have a better life, and then you have leaders that are trying to repress their people, often using religion and other excuses as a reason to try and hold their people down. So when we look at the Palestinians we said what are the opportunities they can have? What's been holding them back economically?

Satloff: ". . .at the Time 100 event you explained that the administration had four big priorities in the Middle East. The first three. . .confronting Iran, defeating ISIS, and combating the ideology of radical Islamic extremism. What makes solving the Israeli/Palestinian crisis an important issue?

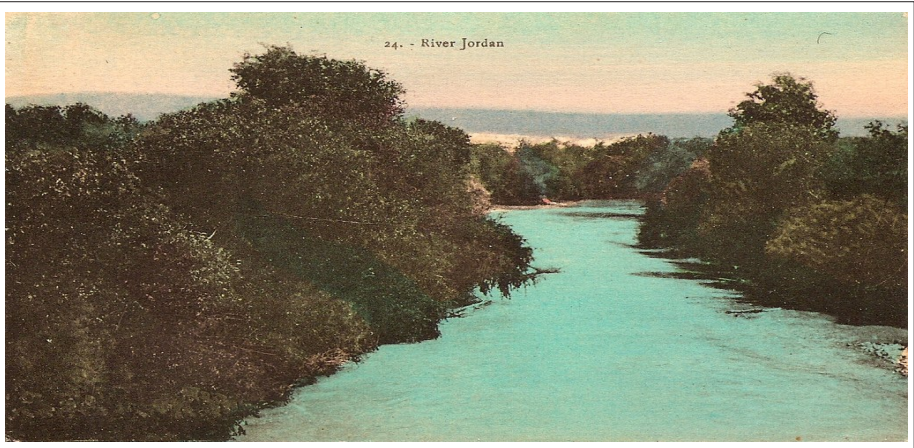
Kushner: ". . .I do think on those first three issues we've made tremendous progress. . . The administration's been very clear with Iran. . .they can't be infringing and trying to destabilize the whole region. That's been a very, very, important issue for the president. And, again, they chant death to Israel, death to America, the same thing that the Houthis do in Yemen. So the Yemen issue, I think, is more an offshoot of the Iran issue. so I kind of put that in the same box because that's the root cause of what's happening there with the instability.

Peace talks without the United Nations Palestine will perish

■ *The Palestinian Authority cuts all ties with the United States after rejecting peace plan*

There is a deceptive tone in the Trump administration's controversial peace plan, "*Peace To Prosperity: A Vision to Improve the Lives of the Palestinian and Israeli People.*"

The 181-page plan dubbed "*deal of the century*" is suppose to serve as the basis to solve the Israeli and Palestinian conflict. Instead, it ignores all of the Palestinians rights, downgrades past resolutions put forth by the United Nations as inconsistent and fails to acknowledge the complex political realities of history, ethnicity and religion.

The past has a direct bearing on the future, this must be recognized. Instead under the terms of this "peace plan" Jared Kushner, President Trump's son-in-law, senior adviser and point man of the plan dismisses the UN and past historical narratives as unproductive. Muhammad H. El-Farra said in his

archived article titled, [The Role of the United Nations Vis-A-Vis The Palestine Question](#) it is the past which makes and conditions the present, and it is the present that molds the future."

In spite of this uncertain situation modern political concerns encourage factual differences such as Biblical minimalist Thomas L. Thompson who admits Israel is a problematic historical study and the Bible cannot be considered reliable evidence for what happened in ancient Israel. Thompson says the questions of history should be

based on evidence and on critical reading of biblical texts, not clouded by religious and political agendas.

Kushner, describes his plan as more practical and fairer than past resolutions of the United Nations, stating it focuses on freedom, respect, security and opportunity. Since the Trump Administration's unveiling of the *Peace to Prosperity* plan reports have circulated of heightened tension against Palestinians who have been living under brutal oppressive military occupation for decades.

Former Israeli solders say Trump wants to "overturn binding international laws to legalize an apartheid solution" Yehuda Shaul served as an infantry combat soldier and commander in the Israeli Defense forces, he is a founding member of the organization "Breaking the Silence." In his article, "[Jared Kushner does not see the brutal occupation I carried out](#)" Shaul writes he enforced two separate legal systems, for Israelis and Palestinians. As an officer Shaul said he stood at checkpoints, carried out arrests, entered families homes in the middle of night

and used grade machine guns to shoot into settlements. Shaul points out that the Trump Administration's peace plan bears a striking resemblance to the "Master Plan for the Development of Settlements in Judea and Samaria" published 40 years ago which places 640,000 settlers in key areas of the West Bank.

The United Nations is an integral part of the peace process, their role is to maintain peace among nations, despite their past failures. The greatest threat to peace, is the expansionist settlements. Nearly two-thirds of the Palestinian territory is under full control by Israel, the E-1 settlement project is new construction which will prevent Palestinians access from the southern part of the West Bank to Jericho and the Jordan Valley to the east. This is noted as an illegal annexation and colonization scheme against Palestinians who are now referred to as "Arab residents" of the city.

For humanity's sake Mr. Kushner, a vision that excludes the UN from peace talks, Palestine will disappear.

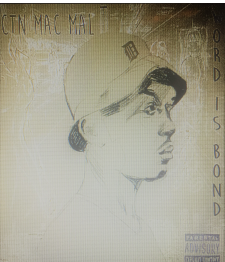

There's an opioid crisis in the nation. Many people are being prescribed these drugs for real medical reasons and becoming addicted to the very drug that is suppose to help them.

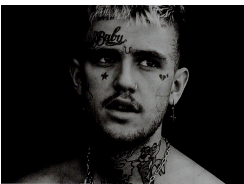
I've talked to many people who say there is no crisis, until it hit the upper class neighborhoods, but whatever the case, there's an epidemic. I saw the rise myself in the hood.
