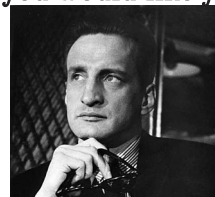

In 1918, this replica of the Statue of Liberty visited Cadillac Square in Downtown Detroit. The purpose was to garner donations to support American troops fighting overseas in World War I. At the time the conflict was called: The Great War. After all, who knew another world war would spark twenty years later? The smaller version of the Statue of Liberty was in Detroit on November 11, 1918. The irony is the war ended on that day. Soon after, troops would be returning home from "over there." It's unclear if the collected funds were ever returned. The one constant in the picture is the historic Wayne County Building. Built in 1897.

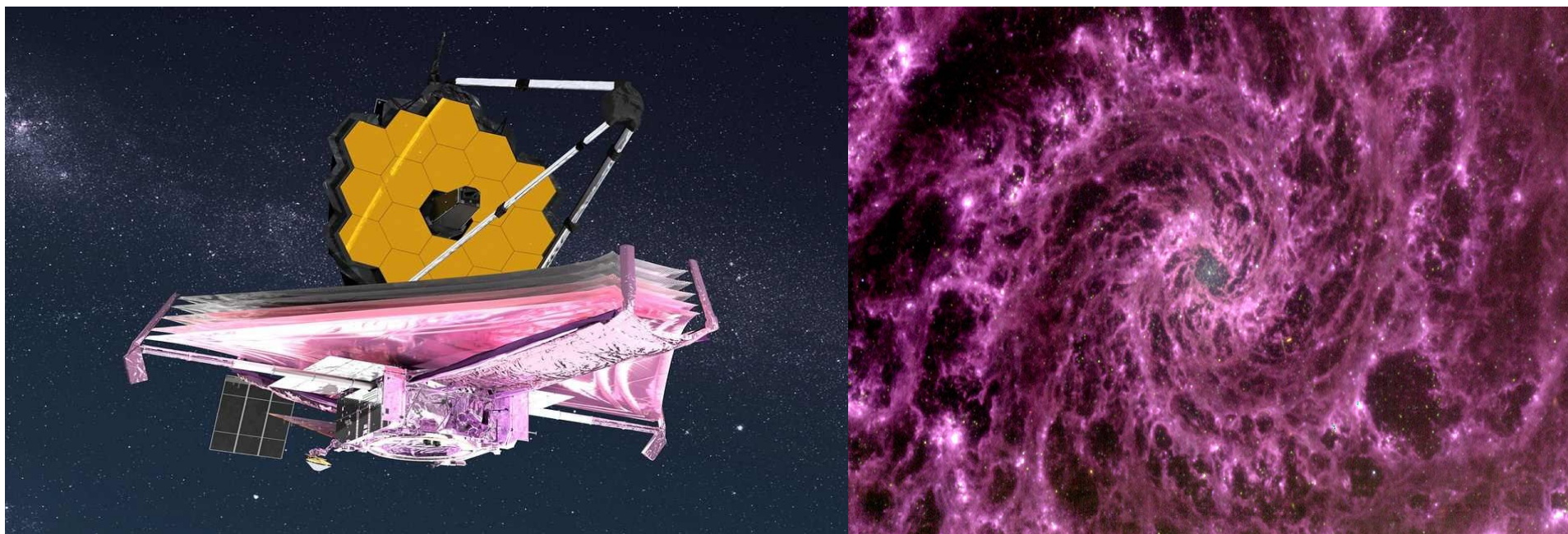

The genesis of the Eastern Market and the Western Market are identical. Both began in the 1850's to serve the citizens of Detroit. The main barns built by the city for vendors are exact matches. (See color inset above left). What used to be the Western Market is now the northbound Fisher freeway. Old timers talk about how vendors used to set up shop around 4 am everyday. They also talk about Gus's. Known as the dirtiest greasy spoon in the city. The restaurant was located on Humboldt street. "Ray 1936" is an online historian and an ex Detroit Police Officer. He patrolled the area and said: "Gus opened at 3 am. The place was packed by 10 am. Many wondered what the black spots were in the oatmeal." Like everything else in the area Gus's was demolished for the freeway.

The James Webb Space Telescope Dazzles

On December 25, 2021 history was made when the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) launched the James Webb Space Telescope. (JWST) The JWST replaces the the Hubble telescope that was launched in 1990. The JWST is the largest telescope in space. It is equipped with a primary mirror that is 21 feet in diameter. (Compared to approximately 7 feet for the Hubble). Another new feature the telescope has is this: Within the 21 foot primary mirror there are 18 hexagonal mirror segments that are made of gold plated beryllium. The light collecting area is 273 square feet. The area is 6 times larger than Hubble. It also boasts new and improved infrared technology that allows the telescope to detect images that would merely be a blur to Hubble. NASA tells us the JWST can look back in time 100 million years. When scientists make statements like that it stupefies many people. How is it possible to look back in time? Here's an example. Light from the Sun takes 8.3 minutes to reach the Earth. According to scientists, when you are looking at the light from the Sun you are, technically, looking back in time. So when a scientist says we are looking back in time 100 million years, he or she will be looking at a distant star from the JWST. The scientist will estimate the light is so far away it would take 100 million years for it to reach Earth. That's the thought process. Does that makes sense to you? If it doesn't, we understand. The fact is: Pictures from space are cool! There's a vast array of stars and planets out there. If the JWST gets us closer, and expands our knowledge and understanding of the great beyond that's good! **See a LIVE video feed from the JWST on our website.**

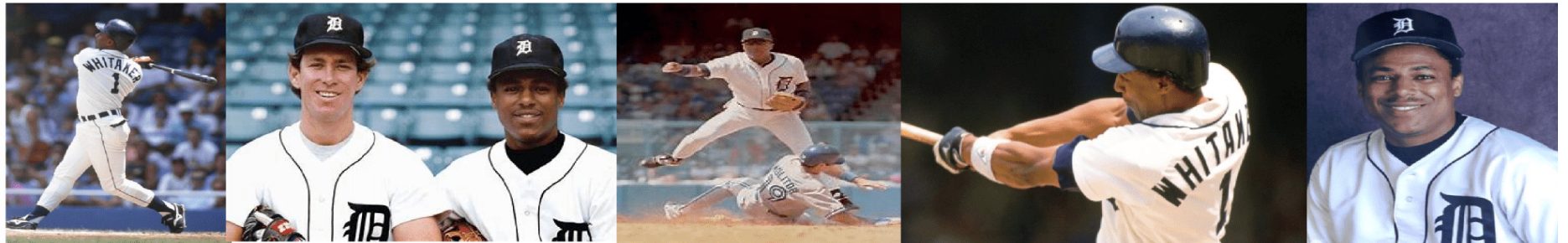

LOU WHITAKER SHOULD BE VOTED INTO THE HALL OF FAME

The Contemporary Era Players Committee Will Make the Decision

It's a travesty that "Sweet Lou" Whitaker is not in the Baseball Hall of Fame. He's an all time great and a Detroit Tigers fan favorite. This article isn't about sentimentality. It's about FACTS! Sweet Lou was a vacuum cleaner in the field. Whitaker won 3 Gold Glove Awards for being the best fielding second baseman in the American League. At the plate Lou was ALWAYS reliable. He was known as the best leadoff man in baseball. Whitaker won 4 Silver Slugger Awards for being the best hitter at his position. Lou Whitaker's statistics are on par with Alan Trammell's. For some reason Trammell (who is deserving) is in the Hall of Fame but Lou Whitaker isn't. Does that make sense to you? Trammell & Whitaker were rookies in 1978, and became the best double play combo of the 1980's. Lou was looked upon as the best one of the pair. Whitaker won the 1978 Rookie of the Year Award. Remarkably, their career stats are very similar. **Batting Average- Hits- Home Runs- Doubles- Triples-Runs Batted In- Runs Scored- Stolen Bases**

The stats don't lie. Out of the eight statistics listed Whitaker beat Trammell in six of them. What's truly amazing is Whitaker achieved his numbers in 19 seasons compared to 20 seasons played by Trammell. That means Trammell had an extra year to catch Whitaker in vital categories such as Hits, RBI, and Home Runs but he still didn't catch up to Lou. The head to head comparison stats of Whitaker and Trammell is more than enough evidence for the committee that's responsible for electing new members. That body is the Contemporary Era Players Committee. They vote on non-elected players that played from 1980 to present. This new committee replaces the Modern Era Committee. The Contemporary Era Committee will vote in December 2022, and every three years thereafter. Lou's .276 batting average is better than five current HOF'ers, including Joe Morgan. Nine HOF'ers have less hits than Whitaker, including Chicago Cubs great Ryne Sandberg. Lou has more home runs than 15 second baseman in the Hall, Roberto Alomar is one of them. Famed Murderers Row second baseman Tony Lazzeri has less runs batted in than Lou. The numbers don't lie. **LOU WHITAKER DESERVES TO BE INDUCTED INTO THE BASEBALL HALL OF FAME!** Hopefully, this article will be read by voters on the Contemporary Era Committee. Hopefully, they will realize that honoring Sweet Lou Whitaker is justified, and frankly, the right thing to do.

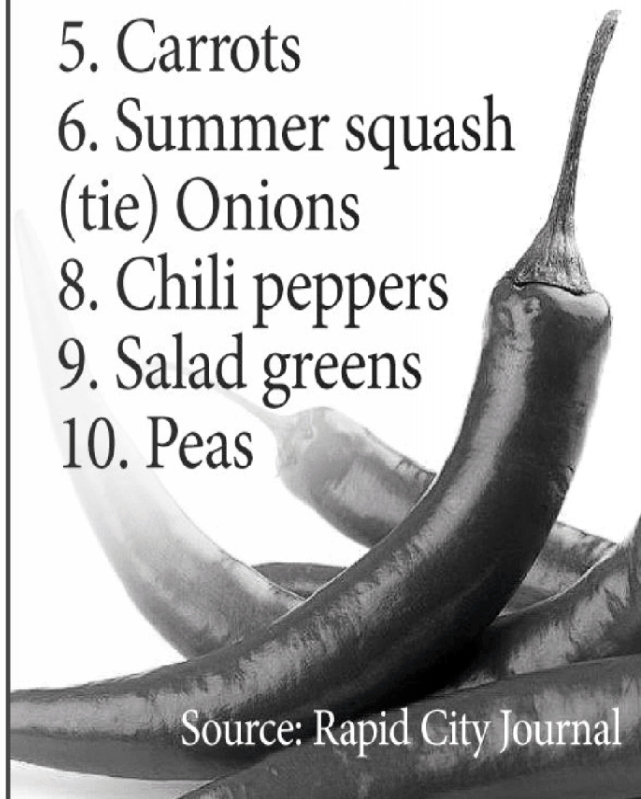

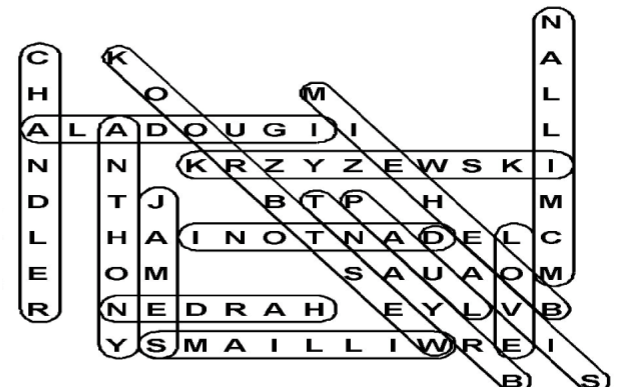

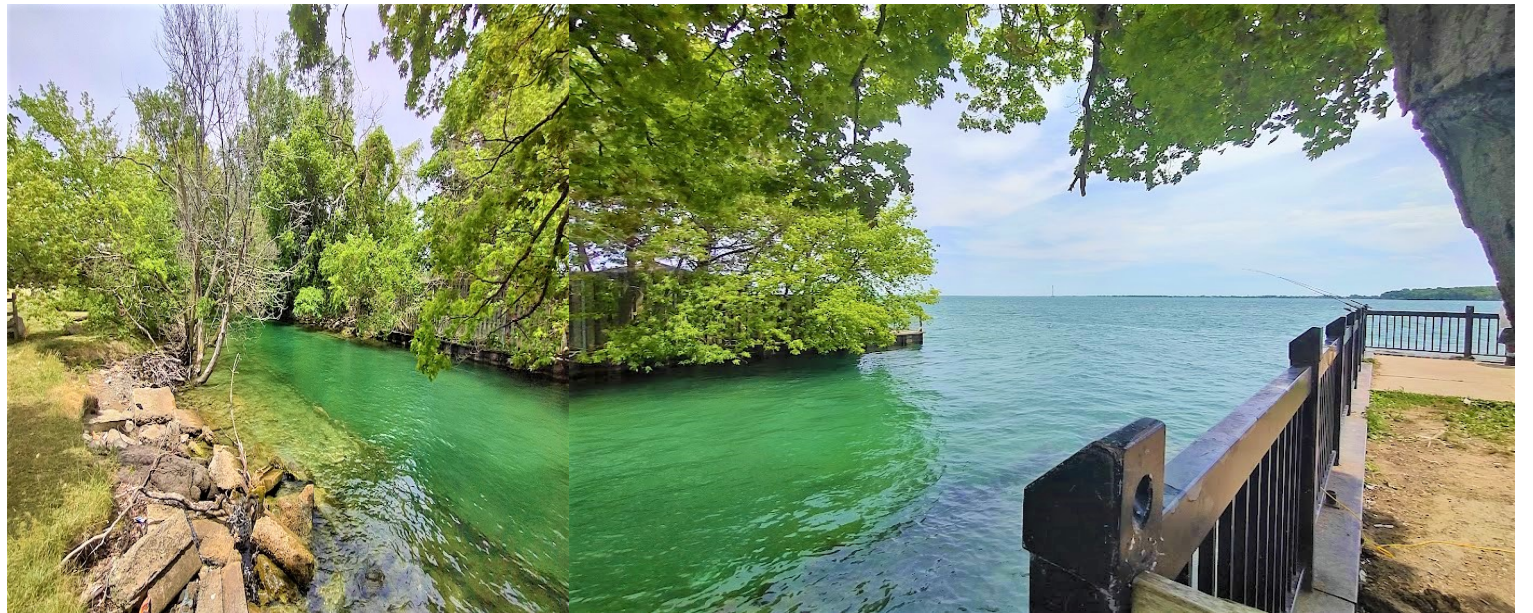
