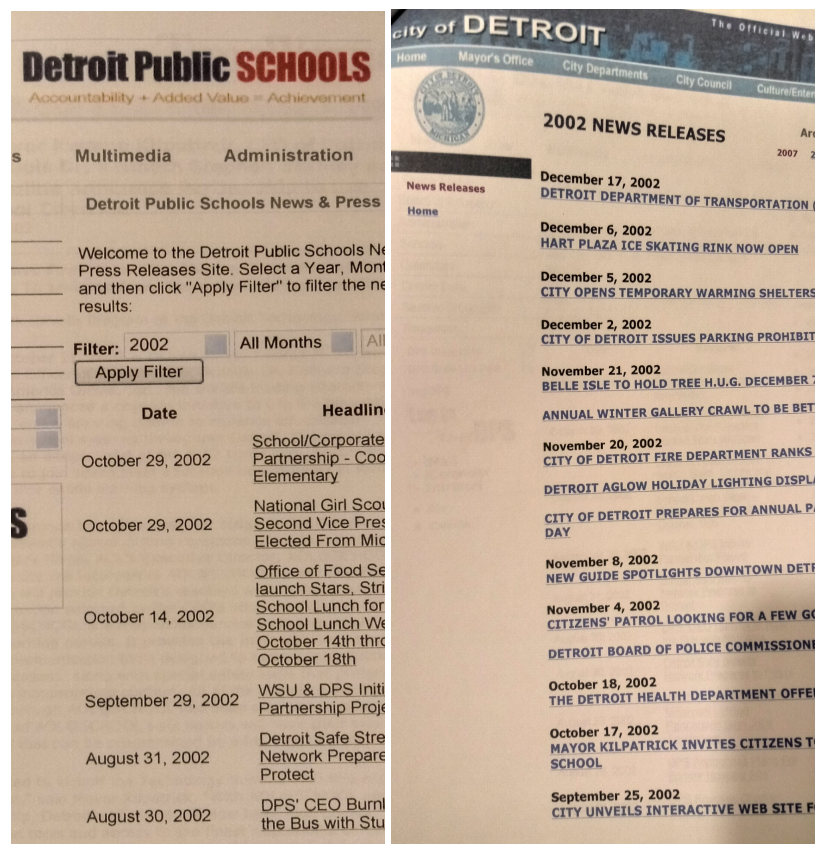
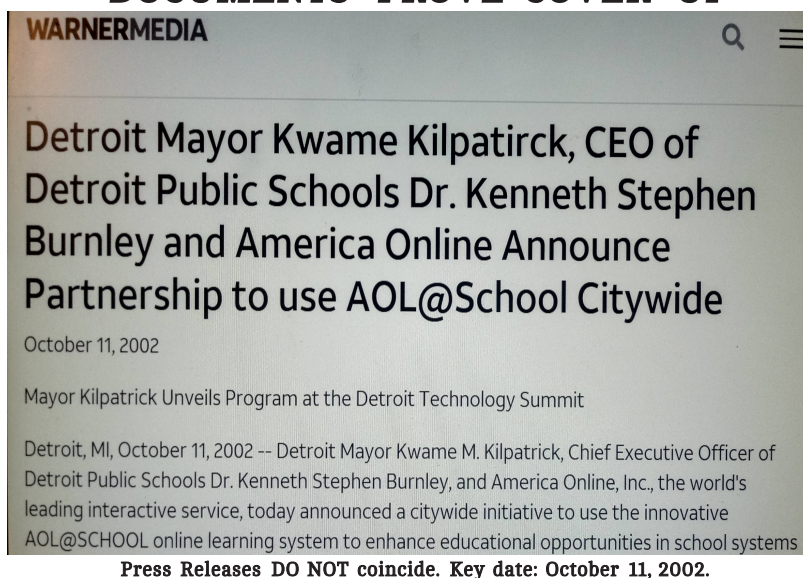
Press Release touts AOL@School but program NEVER Existed

TIME LINE PROVES CORPORATE CORRUPTION

February 27, 2002-Mark Muehl, VP Internet Ops-AOL announces, "AOL has selected Inktomi Personal Edge." AOL relied on Inktomi to test the program. *The Inktomi sponsored laboratory eTesting labs tested for speed and ignored relevance.*

July 5, 2002-The Monthly Standard alerts the AOL-Time Warner Executive Board about their racist search engine. (Steve Case, Ted Turner, Robert Pittman, Gerald Levin, Richard Parsons). Public Relations proposal offers a solution to AOL's racially insensitive problem for a fee.

In the last 10 years-In 2009, Time Warner Inc kicked AOL out of the conglomerate severing ties with them forever. In 2015, Verizon bought AOL. Last year, Time Warner was bought by AT&T. Time Warner is currently known as Warner Media. Both AT&T and Verizon are aware of the racially insensitive AOL Cover-Up. Therefore, they are both liable. Ending systematic racism is the most important issue facing Black people today. Reparations is a pipe dream. It'll never happen. 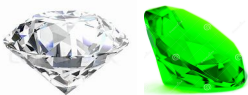

Every year when the Tigers celebrate the legacy of the Detroit Stars of the Negro Leagues I can't help but think back to the mid 1970's and sitting in Tiger stadium hearing my Dad lament how "every ethnicity has a special night at the ballpark, except us". In a city as rich in African American heritage and with the demographic makeup as Detroit was and is, it was shocking to him that the Tiger organization didn't or wouldn't recognize our community with a night. At the time there was for sure an Italian American night, Polish American night, Irish American night and possibly a couple others that escape my memory.

My father, Dr Edward T. Turner Jr was not the kind of man to just complain and accept the circumstances, he got about the business of trying to right that which he saw as wrong. What ensued was a multiple year ordeal with two different tiger ownership groups that seemed anything other than willing to play ball!

The Fetzer family owned the Tigers when my dad began organizing what he first called Negro Night and then changed to African American Night. The idea was to simply use the same marketing campaign being used for all the other heritage nights and encourage members of that community to attend a specific game, receive recognition and have a player from that ethnic group honored in some form or fashion prior to the game. Amazingly the Tiger organization had no interest in meeting with him or exploring his idea. At the time there was a feeling among many in baseball that the sport had become "too black" the stars of the late 60's and 70's more and more were players of color, guys like Willie Mays, Hank Aaron and Roberto Clemente. In my dad's opinion it was typical of the Tigers long history of organizational racism (the Tigers were one of the last teams in major league baseball to integrate) and proved to him that they had no interest in growing the game among the black community.

I remember a particular year when he wanted to honor Yankee greats Reggie Jackson and Willie Randolph but the Tigers wouldn't allow any on field access or promote it, so my Dad contacted the Yankees organization and prior to the game he literally leaned over the rail at the visitor dugout and presented both superstars with plaques, the players seemed genuinely appreciative and were shocked that it had to be done in such a haphazard way.

As memory serves me, when the Monahan family bought the team things got a little better. They agreed to meet with my Dad and a former Negro league player named Elmer Anderson that had joined the cause, and for a few years even allowed a ceremony on the field pre game, and several players were honored including Tiger greats Willie Horton and Lou Whitaker.

If he were alive today I suspect my Dad would be happy to see that not only the Tigers but MLB across the board is doing a better job recognizing the important contributions that people of color have made to the game. I imagine he would also be disappointed with the diminishing numbers of African American players, coaches and managers involved in the game and would probably be working on a plan to do something about it. He loved the game of baseball and the people of the city of Detroit and did everything in his power to bring the two together.
