Local Activists have a better Plan for the State Fairgrounds

The end of the Michigan State Fair in Detroit came when Governor Jennifer Granholm vetoed legislation to provide funding for the annual event on October 30, 2009. Karen Hammer says people were "outraged." That outrage inspired Karen and a couple of her neighbors in Detroit's trendy Greenacres neighborhood to act. They began the State Fairgrounds Development Coalition. (SFDC) "The State Fair was an event that brought people together every year. Urban and rural. Black and white. People came together to celebrate the agricultural and technological wonders that Michigan produced, as well as, to play together, and learn about the animals, and celebrate the music in the area. It was safe, and it was an experience that almost every person we've talked to since the Coalition has formed has reminisced about, longed for, and wished that tradition would continue" says Karen. She was soon joined on the SFDC by her husband Frank. They now serve as Co-Chairs of the organization. Frank mentioned: "The Green New Deal is gaining momentum in Congress. That is something that echos what we are advocating specifically.

The event will be held on Saturday June 22, 2019 in the lot across from 19730 Ralston in Detroit. The Program & Rally will be held from 11 am-2 pm. Live music from 2 pm-4 pm. U.S. Congresswoman Rashida Talib will be a Guest Speaker. Frank added; "We look at Rashida as an advocate on speaking on the issues of the Green New Deal. I would add, When she was a State Rep she was a very strong advocate of community benefits, ordinances, and agreements. A specific developer would have to negotiate with the community where the development was going to be to get the community input and specifications for what the community wanted. So she's going to be an advocate on both area's. The question of community involvement, and the question of bringing in 21st century renewable energy and economic concepts to the Fairgrounds." AOL Search Engine made Blacks synonymous with N-Word

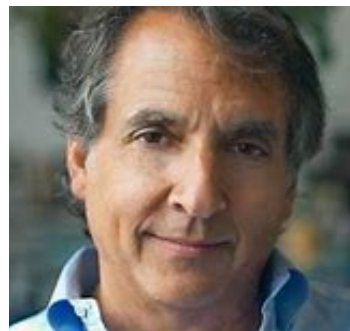
The year 2002 was a pivotal year in the history of AOL. That's the year the downward spiral of the company started. The story of the AOL Cover-Up began at Wayne State University. The Monthly Standard was participating in an African American Seminar taught by visiting Michigan State University Professor Pero Dagbovie. His form of instruction was intense and inspiring. When Yahoo! & Google were searched the results were objectionable, but the N-Word was in the title of each result. Therefore, you got what you asked for. America Online (AOL) was much different. The results on AOL truly made Blacks synonymous with N-Word. AOL results included individuals, organizations, and geographic locations associated with Africa.. AOL results included Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., NAACP, and The Great Ruins of Zimbabwe. Those results represent subtle racism at its core. I was shocked and appalled. Why were AOL's results so different? Two words: RACISM & IRRESPONSIBILITY. The racist results prove Blacks were not a part of the decision making process at AOL. The AOL search engine actually "thought" like a real racist would think. Their results proved it. I'm sure many of you are thinking...How could something like that happen in the first place? It was caused by AOL's need for speed. Their slogan in 2002 was "Easier-Better-Faster"

AOL should have known speed kills. They had a hybrid search engine designed to retrieve faster results. A hybrid search engine uses a crawler based and directory based data to garner results. Apparently the AOL search engine was devoid of the information science known as ontology. This necessary algorithm is needed to limit complexity and organize information. Obviously, the AOL search engine did not have the ontological option. Here's what happened...On July 5, 2002, The Monthly Standard wrote the Executive Board at AOL-Time Warner a public relations letter designed to help the conglomerate. AOL had 35 million paying "members." AOL's racially insensitive problem concerning the N-Word was identified. If the exact same proposal derived from white PR firms Edelman or Ketchum, AOLTW's reaction would've been different. CORPORATE COVER-UP:

Racist Cover-Up could have been Averted with Help from High Profile Blacks

Eradicating Racism in the 21st Century should focus on Right vs. Wrong, not Black vs. White

On July 16, 2002, the AOL Search Engine Cover-Up officially began. That's the day AOL fired its content networking partner, Inktomi. AOL made this decision based upon the conversation between The Monthly Standard (TMS) and AOL representative Pete Sherman. The Monthly Standard enlightened Sherman to the fact that "metatags" were NOT responsible for the racially insensitive results from AOL's search engine. Relevance, not speed, became the new keyword for search engine builders. Worldwide. My accomplishment was stolen.** So why is this a big deal? Catching a media conglomerate with their hand in the cookie jar could end systematic racism. Instead, the media has thrown individuals under the bus (and rightly so) for racist comments. Since 2002, the media has reported on Trent Lott, Don Imus, Paula Deen, Michael Richards, and Donald Sterling. All the while, the BIG FISH get away scot-free. THAT'S NOT FAIR! News organizations do not report on themselves. Time and CNN were under the AOL-Time Warner umbrella, but NBC, CBS, ABC, FOX, Newsweek, The New York Times, and many, many other news organizations were not affiliated to AOLTW. They did not, and still will not, report this story. This is true media collusion. It gets worse. The Monthly Standard has contacted many Black leaders concerning this issue. None have responded favorably. The NAACP, and Detroit's imprisoned ex Mayor Kwame Kilpatrick were involved too. Unfortunately, it was on the side of AOL-Time Warner. The mega-billion dollar multimedia conglomerate had deep pockets, and they knew it. A REAL BLACK-OP COVER STORY PROVES CULPABILITY

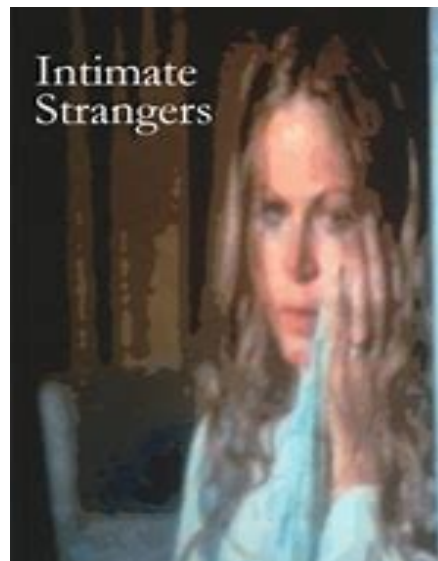
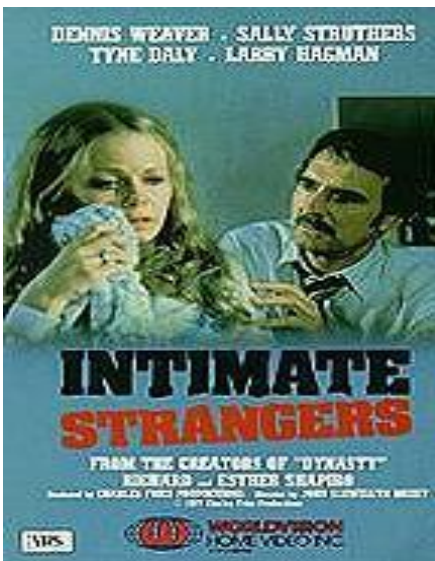
