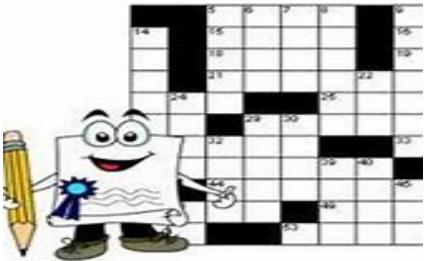

THE 2024 DETROIT TIGERS WILL ROAR!

Lions are not the only big cats that roar. Tigers roar too! It's been a long time since both of Detroit's big cat teams have been competitive at the same time. The Lions are finally good. Now it's the Tigers turn to impress Detroit's rabidly hungry baseball fans. Don't worry. They will not disappoint. At times they will take their lumps. That's normal. Over the course of a long season every team will take their lumps. That's baseball. In the long run, they will prevail. Here's why: The front office had a winning off season. Team President Scott Harris and his new General Manager Jeff Greenberg have intelligently built this team into a legitimate contender. These guys are playing chess. Their strategic plan is going to reap results. The Tigers made eight significant off season additions. (Including 3B coach Joey Cora). Each one of them will equate to (at least) one victory over the course of the season. Their individual statistics will be adequate, but, what really counts is how they mesh on the field AND in the clubhouse. The new players are going to make their teammates better and vice-versa. All of the new acquisitions are good. For me the best one is 35 year old Kenta Maeda. Taking his arm away from the Minnesota Twins cannot be overlooked. This was an outstanding move! All baseball fans know pitching is a vital part of any winning team. Last year the Tigers had the 7th best WHIP (walks plus hits per innings pitched) in the American League. That's something to build on and they are already doing it. Last season the Tigers team ERA was 4.24. This spring their team ERA is 3.86. In comparison the Twins are going the other way. So far their team ERA has risen to 4.10 this spring compared to 3.87 last season.

Can the Tigers maintain a low team ERA throughout the season? Absolutely. That's why Harris and Greenberg brought in 28 year old, Jack Flaherty. Traditionally Flaherty has had a low WHIP and ERA throughout his career. He signed a one year PROVE IT deal that's stacked with performance incentives. Flaherty is not the only new Tiger pitcher to sign a PROVE IT deal. Ex Tiger Andrew Chafin and Shelby Miller both signed one year deals with a club option for the 2025 season. Chafin, 33, returns to the Tigers after appearing in 63 games between the Arizona Diamondbacks and Milwaukee Brewers in 2023, posting a 3-4 record with a career-best eight saves, a 4.73 ERA (51.1IP/27ER) and 63 strikeouts. He finished the season strong, posting a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP/2ER) with eight strikeouts in 12 outings during September/October. Miller, 33, put together an impressive 2023 season with the Los Angeles Dodgers, appearing in 36 games, including one start, and posting a 3-0 record with one save, a 1.71 ERA (42.0IP/8ER) and 42 strikeouts. He finished the season with a 0.90 WHIP and limited opponents to a .135 batting average. Among National League relievers with at least 40.0 innings pitched last season, Miller ranked second with a 0.90 WHIP and .131 opponent batting average, while he was sixth with a 1.76 ERA. The new guys add to an already potent pitching staff. Young hurlers Tarik Skubal, Matt Manning, and Tyler Holton are quite formidable. Each of them should take a major step forward. Closer Alex Lange should have another solid season. Hopefully, Casey Mize can recover from the back and arm issues that have plagued his big league career. If so, he will fortify an already solid core.

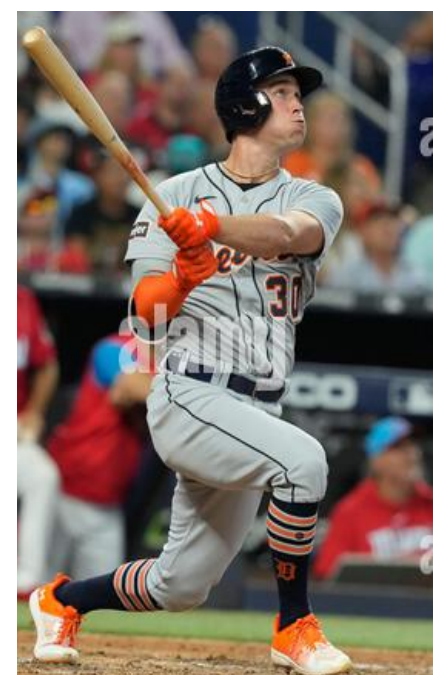
We are confident in the Tigers pitching staff, but, can they hit? So far this spring the boys are not tearing the leather off of the ball, but it's a long season. Andy Ibanez is having a very productive spring at the plate. He should be penciled in at second base to start the season. Newcomer Mark Canha is a proven major league hitter. His veteran presence should help young up and comers like Parker Meadows, and Colton Keith. Speaking of youngsters Kerry Carpenter and Spencer Torkelson are out to prove their 2023 campaigns were not flukes. Both of them want to show they are legitimate major league baseball players and are in the big leagues to stay. The Monthly Standard predicts the signing of Gio Urshela, 32, is going to pay dividends. This veteran leads by example. Urshela also signed an incentive laden PROVE IT deal. He is just one year removed from one of the best seasons of his career. In 2022, he played in 144 games with the Twins and batted .285 with 27 doubles, three triples, 13 home runs and 64 RBI. He established new career-highs in hits (143), walks (41) and games played. Urshela was limited to 62 games in 2023 after suffering a season-ending injury on June 15. Urshela hit .299 with eight doubles, one triple, two home runs and 24 RBI. At the time of his injury, Urshela ranked seventh in the AL in batting average. We cannot forget about Javier Baez. A certain radio host in town (a non-Detroiter) has been reading him the riot act and yelling for the Tigers to trade him. Baez is a shortstop. His main job is defense. Baez may never match the batting statistics he had at Chicago's hitter friendly Wrigley Field. He plays at pitcher friendly Comerica Park. Most importantly, Baez is still a wizard on defense and continues to impress. As long as Baez clogs up the middle on defense he's an asset to the team. Whatever we get from our shortstop offensively is a bonus. Baez will be fine. The Lions aren't the only big cats who can ROAR in Detroit. The Tigers will win the AL Central and confidently enter into the playoffs. With great pitching and timely hitting anything could happen in the post season. World Series? YES! It is not out of the realm of possibility. **GO GET 'EM TIGERS!**

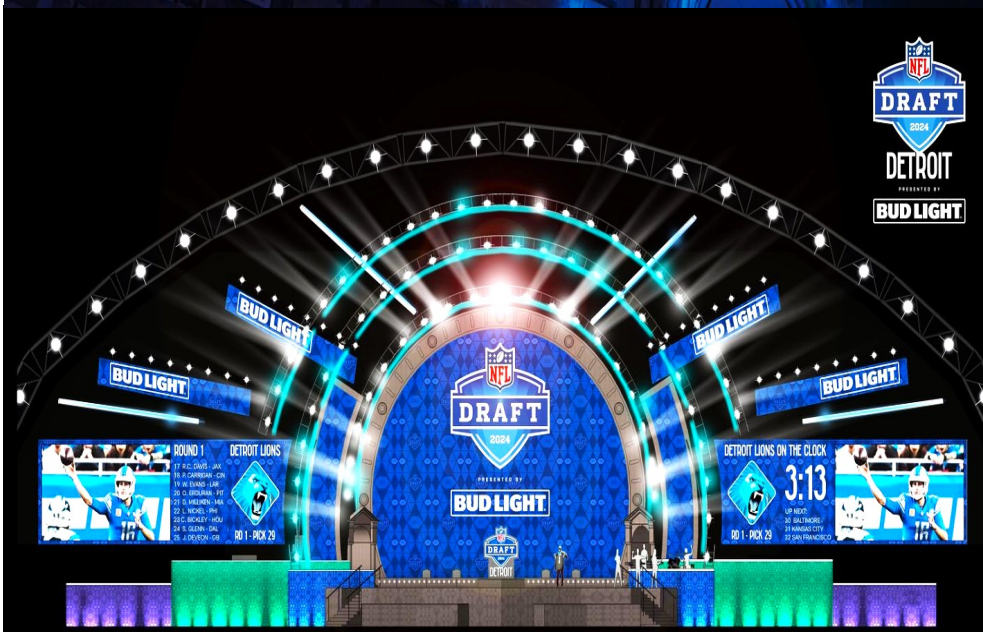

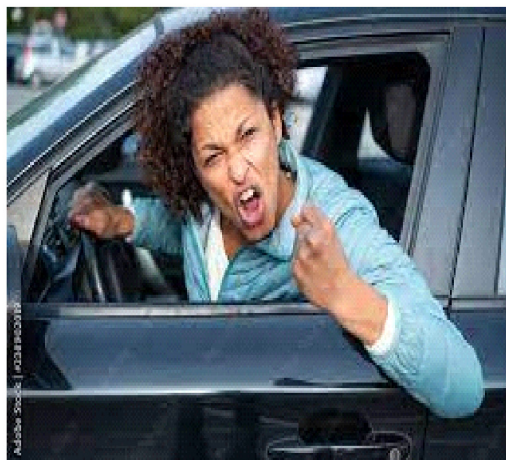

Kiwanis Club Provides Free Books for Kids

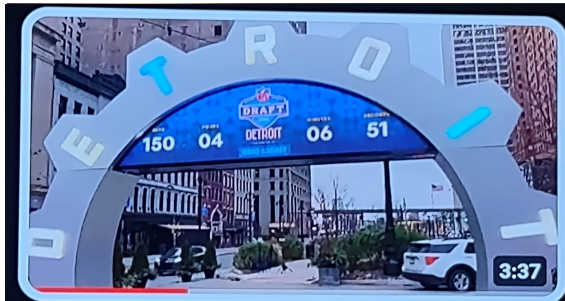

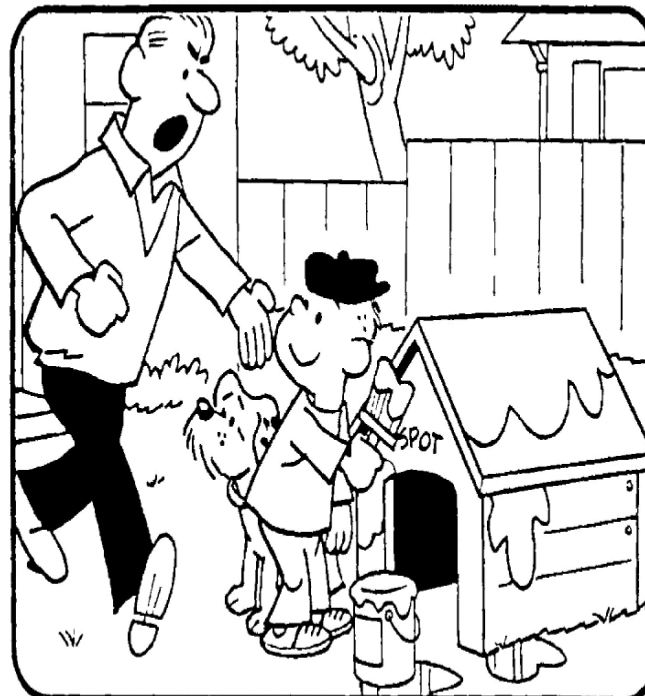

1. STIPULATED PAYMENT AGREEMENT:

Puts you on a schedule to avoid foreclosure. (As long as you maintain your payments).

2. DISTRESSED OWNER OCCUPANT EXTENSION:


For those suffering financial hardship. (Must prove hardship, occupancy, and ownership).

3. PAY AS YOU STAY AGREEMENT:

Apply for Poverty Tax Exemption in your city. (If approved, county will reduce your payments).

4. INTEREST REDUCTION STIPULATED PAYMENT AGREEMENT:

If eligible, this plan reduces your interest rate from 18% to 6%.
