Both scenes depicted above were taken on St. Antoine looking south towards Clinton Street. In the 1980 photo, on the left, is General Hospital. Yes, Detroit had a General Hospital, and it still exists today. It's called Detroit Receiving Hospital. Here's the history. Detroit Receiving was founded in 1915. In 1965 the name was changed to Detroit General. That name lasted until 1980. That's when Detroit General reclaimed its former name of Detroit Receiving and moved to its current location in the Medical Center. The old building was promptly demolished and replaced with the Wayne County Juvenile Detention Facility. Across Macomb Street you can see the Greektown Casino and parking garage. In both photographs the spire of Old St. Mary's Church and the Blue Cross Blue Shield building can be seen in the distance. If you look closely you'll see the logo's weren't attached to the Blue Cross building yet.

ABC NEWS STATEMENT FROM FROM 1990 HOLDS TRUE:

"The Only Thing Detroit's Suburbs Lack are Blacks"

Thirty years ago an ABC News report said *Detroit and its suburbs were among the most segregated in the United States.* It was true then and it's true now. Coleman Young knew Detroit had a race problem too. He said: "I've become a code word for Black. To attack Detroit is to attack Black. Politicians run for office by attacking Detroit." Young had to be the most perceptive person that ever lived. When ABC News reporter Judd Rose, who was in town to discuss issues affecting Detroit, brought up South African krugerrands, Coleman Young shut him down. QUICK! "You came here to do a chop job. Obviously. And that's what you did." After cursing him out, Young said: "You're out of line, and this interview is concluded." Nobody was more in control than Mayor Coleman A. Young. He was a great man in a tough position. When Young became the Mayor of Detroit in 1974 the city's population was roughly 1.5 million. When Young was interviewed for the ABC News special that aired on November 8, 1990, Detroit's population was approximately 1 million. The vast majority of the 500,000 souls that left Detroit were white people. A fact that ABC News was not going to ignore. Here's the intro to this story from ABC anchor Diane Sawyer: *In this community the rich are divided from the poor. The races divided from each other, and it's all compounded by violence and drugs. We're talking about Detroit.* Today Detroiters continue to live segregated lives. There has been racial tension in Detroit ever since the race riot of 1943. That was the LAST Black vs. White race riot in the USA. (The ABC News report called the Rebellion of 1967 a race riot. They were wrong). Thirty years ago, ABC News said Whites felt Detroit was: "Alien, threatening, a place they want no part of." This is confirmed by Norm Bittner (deceased) from Warren, Michigan. Bittner said: "Who wants 'em...The white families have moved out of Detroit and left Detroit to the Colereds." (Blacks)

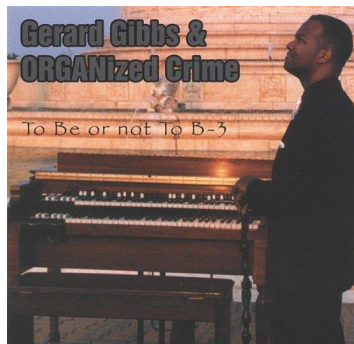

Listen to Gerard Gibbs and You Will Agree, He is Truly the Best Pianist on Earth

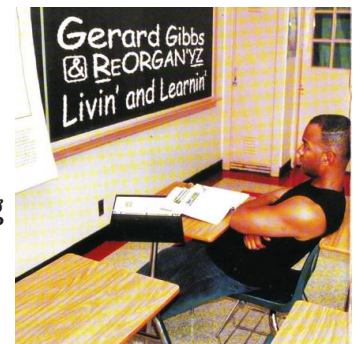


Gerard Gibbs is an extremely talented pianist. Here at The Monthly Standard we feel he is the best jazz pianist in the world. We were going to write this article last year but Gerard was in Europe performing in Paris, France. Gibbs is in demand. Gerard is not just a jazz pianist. He plays all music. The Lions Couldn't Win with Stafford, Can They Win Without Him?

A New GM, Coach, and QB hope to Change the Fortunes of Snake-Bitten Franchise

The blockbuster trade with the Rams in late January officially brought the Matthew Stafford era in Detroit to a close. After 12 years he amassed 282 passing touchdowns. A Lions record. As one door closes, a new one opens. New General Manager (Brad Holmes) added a new Head Coach (Dan Campbell) and a new Quarterback. (Jared Goff) These major changes are not often seen in the NFL in one offseason. Change seems to be the theme of the Lions offseason and that leaves them (and us) with vital questions that need to be answered. Is Jared Goff a bridge quarterback, or the future? Also, what should they do with the 7th pick in the upcoming NFL Draft? There's one thing we definitely know for sure. The Lions are once again in rebuilding mode. The Lions just traded away one of the best players in the history of the franchise. Considering Stafford is gone, the best thing the Lions can do is amass assets and rebuild. Last year, the Lions were a bottom five offensive and defensive team. Detroit ranked last in yards and points allowed on defense. Considering those facts, there's no doubt it's time for the Lions to start rebuilding. That being said, what about Jared Goff? He was the number one overall pick back in 2016, and signed a 4-year deal with the Rams that the Lions still have to pay a part of. Looking at his contract, the Lions are locked in for the first two years. However, according to Spotrac.com, the Lions could get rid of Goff's contract in 2023 without worrying about any dead cap. On the bright side, Goff has shown he can be effective in a run-based scheme. One simply has to look at the productive years of Todd Gurley in Los Angeles to see how much a good running back can benefit Goff. In 2018, Goff was at his peak. He threw 32 touchdowns to only 12 interceptions. Unfortunately, Jared Goff is a quarterback who is elevated by his team and not the other way around. When Todd Gurley's injuries got the best of him, Goff stopped ascending, and hasn't looked quite the same since the 2018 season. He hasn't thrown for more than 22 touchdowns since. Jared Goff is by no means a bad QB. He fits the mold of a bridge quarterback. I predict Goff will be a temporary fix until the Lions find their eventual QB of the future. Considering their current circumstances and draft capital the Lions shouldn't reach for a quarterback in the upcoming draft. But, if a certain quarterback is available, it might be too good for the Lions to pass up. That quarterback is Trey Lance. He's a really raw QB talent from North Dakota State with an extremely high upside. Lance has all the measurables you could ask for. He's 6'4" and 224 pounds. Lance played well at North Dakota State. He finished his only full year with 28 touchdowns and 0 interceptions. That's an eye-catching stat, but, it should be considered that he was playing against Division II competition. Lance is a classic boom or bust pick. If he is able to sit and learn the position by observing Goff for a year, or two, he could be the future of the Detroit Lions. All in all, this is going to be an interesting offseason for the Lions. They are obviously going in a new direction. A new regime is establishing a new culture and they have some key decisions to make. The Lions aren't currently in the Super Bowl picture but the goal remains the same: Bring a championship to the city of Detroit. Holmes and Campbell have work to do to bring this team into the contending conversation, and Goff has a lot to live up to fill Stafford's shoes. If the Lions are smart they will replicate what made Goff successful in Los Angeles. That will probably happen. With Brad Holmes, the former L.A. Rams front office guru calling the shots, it's a safe bet improving the Lions running game is a top priority. Stay tuned Lions fans for more updates. LOU WHITAKER SHOULD BE VOTED INTO THE HALL OF FAME The Modern Era Committee Will Make the Decision

It's a travesty that "Sweet Lou" Whitaker is not in the Baseball Hall of Fame. He's an all time great and a Detroit Tigers fan favorite. This article isn't about sentimentality. It's about FACTS! Sweet Lou was a vacuum cleaner in the field. Whitaker won 3 Gold Glove Awards for being the best fielding second baseman in the American League. At the plate Lou was ALWAYS reliable. He was known as the best leadoff man in baseball. Whitaker won 4 Silver Slugger Awards for being the best hitter at his position. Lou Whitaker's statistics are on par with Alan Trammell's. For some reason Trammell (who is deserving) is in the Hall of Fame but Lou Whitaker isn't. Does that make sense to you? Trammell & Whitaker were rookies in 1978, and became the best double play combo of the 1980's. Lou was looked upon as the best one of the pair. Whitaker won the 1978 Rookie of the Year Award. Remarkably, their career stats are very similar. **Batting Average- Hits- Home Runs- Doubles- Triples-Runs Batted In- Runs Scored- Stolen Bases**

The stats don't lie. Out of the eight statistics listed Whitaker beat Trammell in six of them. What's truly amazing is Whitaker achieved his numbers in 19 seasons compared to 20 seasons played by Trammell. That means Trammell had an extra year to catch Whitaker in vital categories such as Hits, RBI, and Home Runs but he still didn't catch up to Lou. The head to head comparison stats of Whitaker and Trammell is more than enough evidence for the committee that's responsible for electing new members. That body is the 16 member Modern Era Baseball Committee. That is the same committee that elected Alan Trammell, and another Tiger great Jack Morris. There are 20 second basemen in the Hall of Fame. Lou's stats are as good or better than many Hall of Fame second basemen. Lou's .276 batting average is better than 5 HOF'ers, including Joe Morgan. Lou has more hits than 9 second basemen in the Hall, one of which is Ryne Sandberg. Lou has more Home Runs than 15 of the second basemen in the Hall. One of them happens to be Roberto Alomar. Sweet Lou has more runs batted in than noted HOF Murders Row 2nd baseman Tony Lazzeri. The Modern Era Committee votes again in 2022. Obviously, we don't think it's too early to start campaigning. Induct Sweet Lou in the Hall in 2022!

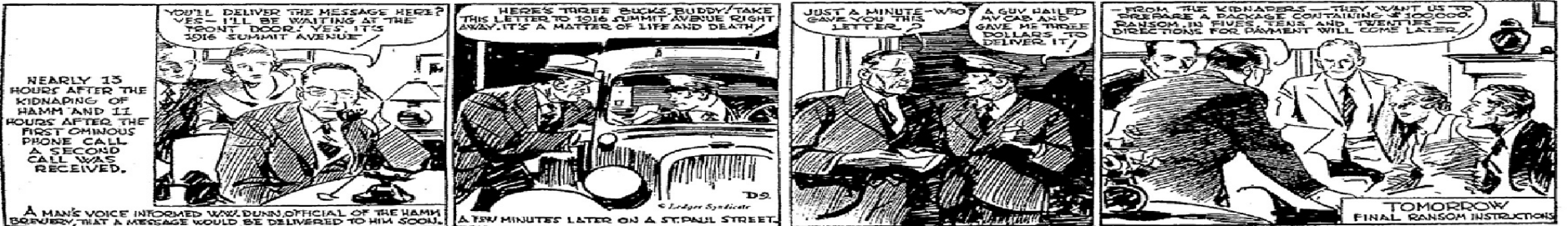


