

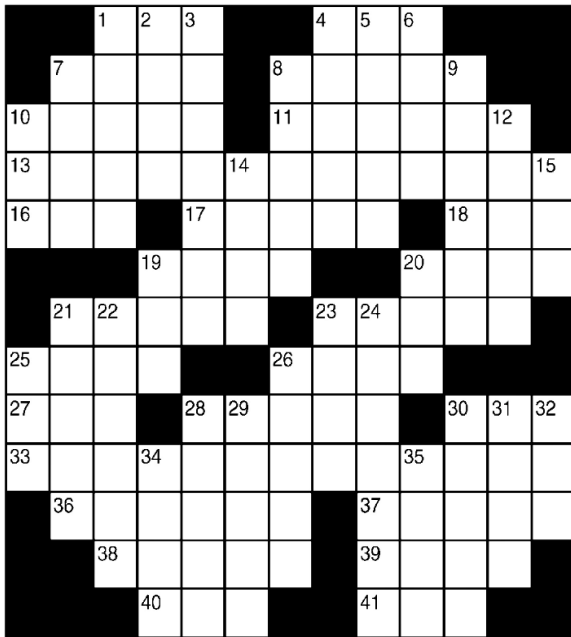

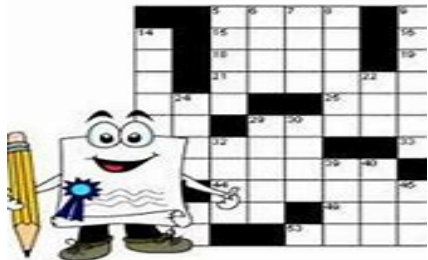

DETROIT HISTORICAL SOCIETY ACCEPTING NOMINATIONS FOR CELEBRATION OF BLACK ENTREPRENEURS

The Detroit Historical Society has announced a new program that will celebrate Detroit's Black Entrepreneurs with a series of exhibits, public programs and educational offerings. *The Hustle: Celebrating Detroit's Unsung Entrepreneurs* is an effort to dig deep into Detroit's neighborhoods to uncover and document the stories of the men and women who make everyday life in Detroit special. Elana Rugh, President and CEO of the Detroit Historical Society, says that this program is another example of The Society's commitment to tell *all* of Detroit's stories and why they matter. "We are celebrating our 100th anniversary this year, and yet these stories have never been featured in our museums. As we work to become Detroit's museum for the *next* 100 years we are committed to making sure that every Detroiter sees themselves on our walls and in our halls. This is just one of many programs and exhibitions that will tell unexpected stories and feature the unsung heroes of Detroit's history." *The Hustle* will begin with crowdsourced nominations for entrepreneurs that cross generations of Detroiters; 36 nominees will be selected for the museum exhibits that will be staged at the Detroit Historical Museum in 2022 and 2023. Later, the project will feature panel discussions, tours and educational programming offering lots of ways for people of all ages to participate in the celebration. The project will conclude in 2023 with a Grand Ball and a major exhibition. *The Hustle*, like the Detroit Historical Society itself, needs Detroiters' support to help make it a success. Nominations for Detroiters with hustle are being accepted now online or on paper; look for nomination forms in businesses throughout Detroit's neighborhoods. Every Detroiter nominated will see his or her name in the Detroit Historical Museum, and 36 nominees will be featured in one of four quarterly exhibitions planned for 2022 and 2023.

You can visit the Detroit Historical Society's website to make a nomination at detroithistorical.org. Nomination forms are also available in postcard form which can be found in the businesses that form the cornerstones of the community in Detroit neighborhoods everywhere. *The Hustle* is supported by Rocket Community Fund, Toyota USA, The Auto Club Group/AAA, Bank of America, and JP Morgan Chase.

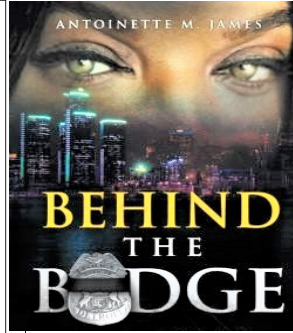

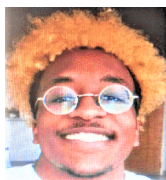

Pistons Cunningham is Frontrunner to Win R.OY. Award

Last July the Pistons selected Cade Cunningham with the 1st pick in the NBA Draft. Fast forward. The NBA's regular season has come to an end. Cade Cunningham has more than lived up to expectations and is firmly in the Rookie of the Year race going into the offseason. After a moderately slow start compared to his contemporaries in the class like Evan Mobley and Scottie Barnes, Cunningham really found his stride after the All-Star break. Since the break, he has averaged 21 points, 6 rebounds, and 6 assists per game. Not every young player has great synergy with Cunningham. Killian Hayes feels redundant with the emergence of Cunningham as a ball handler. Trading Hayes for more assets could be in the best interest of the Pistons. As Cunningham's game matures, he should be a versatile 6'6" guard who can score and distribute. The Pistons have another lottery pick inbound the upcoming NBA Draft. The team has scorers, now they need to toughen up and play Pistone basketball. That means DEFENSE. If they do that the team will earn a playoff berth in the 2022-23 season.

Wings Miss Playoffs, AGAIN, Yzerman Fires Blashill

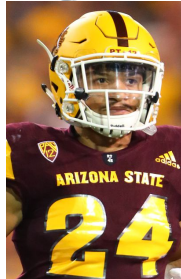

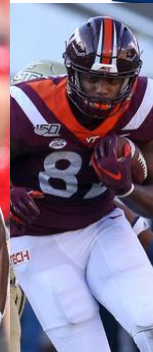

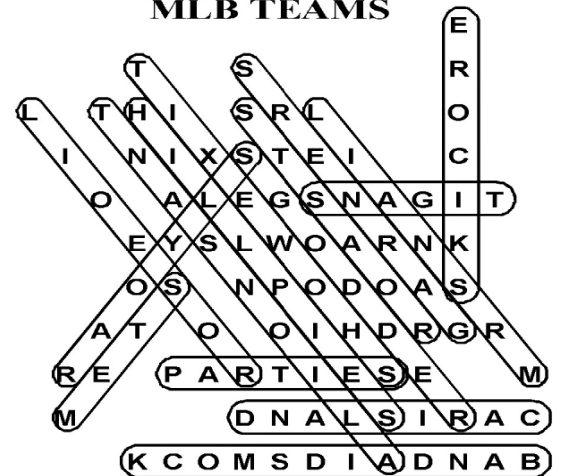
