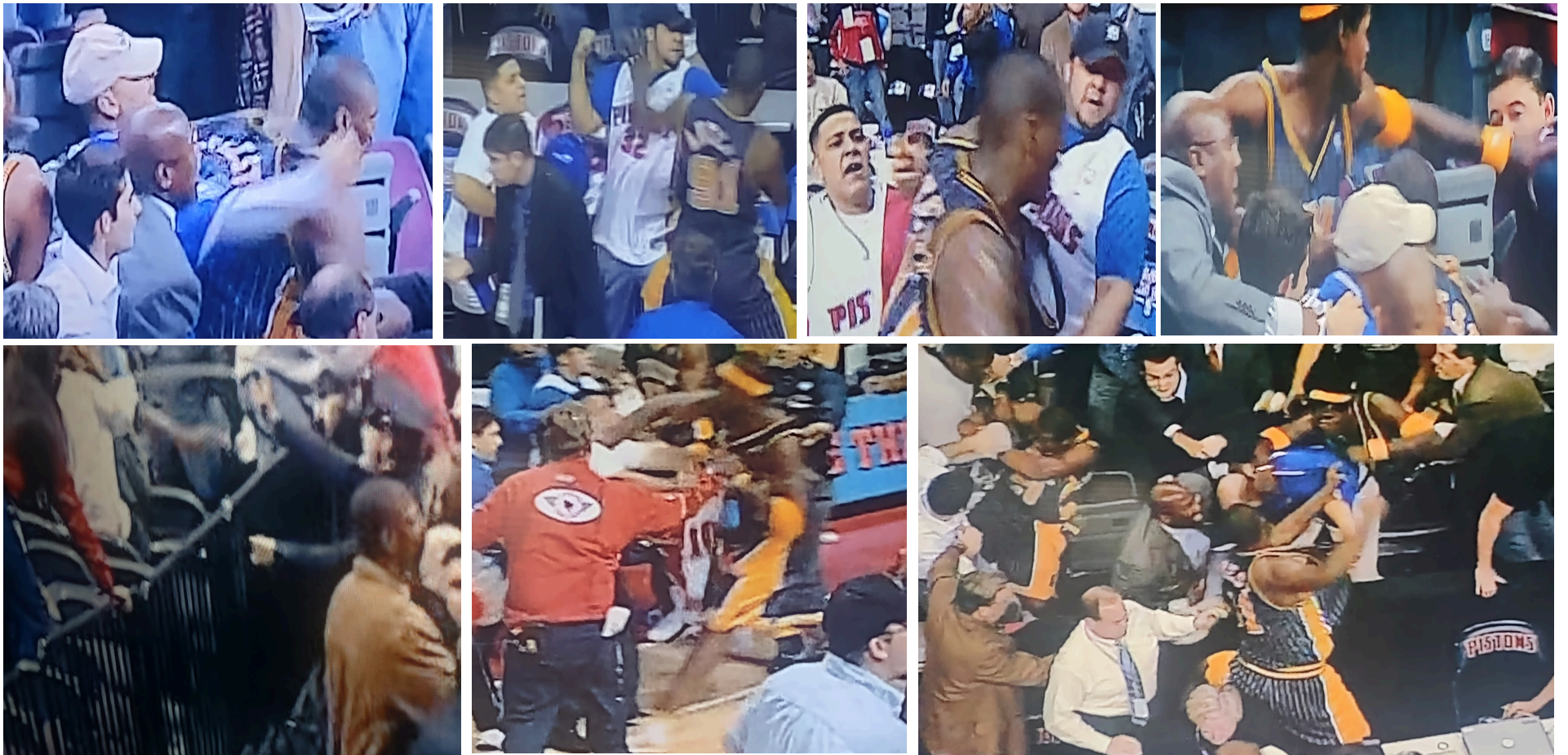

YouTubers Overwhelmingly Reject Fox 2's Analysis of the Samantha Woll Murder Trial

On October 21, 2023 Samantha Woll was brutally murdered in her condominium located in Downtown Detroit. This case made headlines across the USA. Samantha Woll was an attractive woman who was a prominent member of the Jewish community. These are the type of cases that bring pressure to the police. **THEY MUST FIND, AND ARREST, A SUSPECT.** Unfortunately, pressure from the public (and other sources) can cause the police to err. Michael Jackson-Bolanos was the suspect arrested by police. Bolanos is an admitted car thief who was out that night looking to steal. But was he looking to kill? Based on the evidence presented at the trial, The Monthly Standard (TMS) does not think so. The mostly white jury did not think so either. Michael Jackson-Bolanos was acquitted of first degree murder. The jury was deadlocked on the other serious charges of felony murder and home invasion. Consequently, those charges were dismissed. Bolanos, convicted of lying to the police, is currently serving an 18 month sentence in prison. The person most people believe killed Samantha Woll is her ex-boyfriend, Jeffrey Herbstman. Three weeks after Woll's murder Herbstman freaked out and confessed to murdering Samantha Woll. Herbstman blames his freakout on the prescription drug Auvelity. Defense Attorney Brian Brown believes Herbstman "had a guilt induced episode because he knew what he did." It seems most people deemed the case against Bolanos weak. Except Fox 2 anchor Taryn Asher. TMS left her a voicemail that went unanswered. We asked her why her report was slanted towards the family and ignored the convincing case made by the defense? We feel sorrow for the family too, but, as journalists we have to tell the family the truth and not use our media authority to pacify.

Taryn is a good news reader, but she dropped the ball on her report. I have to give it an F. Here's why. 1. SHE IGNORED THE DEFENSE-Attorney Brian Brown told TMS Asher interviewed him in his office for 30 minutes. Brown was in Asher's report for only TWO SECONDS! 2. THE TOP COP?-Asher speaks to DPD Lt. Matthew Bray and calls him the "lead investigator." What kind of lead investigator is not called at the trial? According to Atty. Brown, Bray did not sign any warrants and was not endorsed by the prosecution. Which means the prosecutor did not think Bray was important to the case. Asher should've interviewed Lt. Sanchez from the Michigan State Police. (MSP) 3. HERBSTMAN'S FIRE PIT-Asher's report says police searched "the fire pit." That's not true. It came out in court that MSP Trooper Rodriguez looked at the fire pit but did not analyze the fire pit for clothes or accelerants. Looking and searching are very different. 4. THE BLOOD-Bolanos had trace amounts of blood on his jacket. Even if he washed it, police use luminol to detect blood. If his jacket was blood-soaked the prosecutor would've spoke about it in court. He didn't. Also, the backpack Bolanos carried that night was devoid of blood. Many citizens feel Jeffrey Herbstman got away with murder. It's common knowledge Woll had an extra key. It's not a reach to say Herbstman had access to it. Also, Bolanos is a thief. If he was in her house why didn't he take her wallet and car keys that were at the door? There were also bloody footprints in Woll's house that were not hers or from Bolanos. Not guilty? YES! Herbstman's family is influential. He got immunity. Only the guilty hide behind that cloak.

MALICE AT THE PALACE

It has been two decades since that fateful night in November 2004, when a rivalry turned into one of the most infamous moments in sports history: the Malice at the Palace. The scene unfolded at the (now demolished) Palace of Auburn Hills, where the Detroit Pistons faced off against the Indiana Pacers in what was an awaited early season matchup between the defending NBA champion Pistons and the up and coming Pacers. Instead, it became a chaotic spectacle that shocked the sports world and left lingering questions about race, violence, and the culture of professional basketball. The incident erupted after a hard foul by Ron Artest, then a key player for the Pacers, on Pistons center Ben Wallace. Tensions escalated quickly when a heated Wallace violently pushed Artest. Wanting to avoid a serious confrontation with Wallace, Artest decided to lay down on the scorers table to until tensions calmed down. Artest wasn't docile for long. When a drink was thrown at him from the stands, hitting him in the chest, an enraged Artest charged into the crowd, igniting a brawl that involved players, fans, and security personnel. Stephen Jackson, a loyal and fiery teammate of Artest, jumped in to defend him, making the situation even more volatile. What transpired next was disturbing: Players fighting in the stands coupled with fans throwing punches, beer, and anything else they could get their hands on. What was initially a basketball rivalry devolved into an all-out melee, spilling from the stands onto the basketball court itself. The incident marked a dark chapter in NBA history and displayed Metro Detroit's history of racial division.

THE RACIAL COMPONENT

For those who don't know the Detroit metropolitan area is the most segregated community in the United States. Detroit has ALWAYS had racial tensions that carry on this very day. In the year 1943, the last Black vs. White race riot was in Detroit. **(The Monthly Standard-June/July '23 issue)** That's why the actions of the white cops from the Auburn Hills Police Department are important. In a riot situation the mob mentality can controls the mind. That's what happened to the officers in the Auburn Hill Police Department. (AHPD) Instead of being professional law enforcement officers, overwhelming video and photographic evidence, prove their focus was seeking out black people. It did not matter that some the black people were NBA players that made more in a month than they did in a year. They had the power! The officers (whose names aren't as important as their actions) proved Metro Detroit still has a racial problem. Moreover, the Detroit media proves it too. Not one media outlet in Detroit reported this angle of the story. Are they blind? No. They just do not care when black men are unfairly targeted. That carelessness fits the national media too. For many, the brawl highlighted deeper issues within society. The incident was scrutinized not just for its physicality but for the racial dynamics at play. The visuals of black NBA players clashing with white police officers during the aftermath of the brawl fed into a narrative that is all too familiar in American culture. Here we had black athletes, seen through the lens of societal stereotypes, in dispute with authority figures in a space that is supposed to celebrate camaraderie and competition. Take a hard look at the pictures associated with this article. You'll see a white cop about to mace a black NBA player (Ron Artest) in uniform!!! That action, in and of itself, proves this cop had the mob mentality. For him it was Black vs. White. It had to be. There were unauthorized white fans all over the court but this cop, and his cohorts, ran past white rioters so they could accost black NBA players.

THE GUY IN THE BLACK CAP & MORE RACISM

Here are the facts. Metro Detroit has a long standing problem between the races. Said problem was in full effect the night of November 19, 2004. He was yelling at Artest. Then he threw what looked like a jacket at Artest. To avoid another confrontation Artest backed away and his teammates, including Reggie Miller, surrounded him. Even still, the Guy in the Black Cap continued to advance. Out of nowhere a charging officer from the AHPD appeared. Instead of arresting the white rioter, who was threatening NBA players, on an NBA basketball court, the cop ignored the white Guy in the Black Cap, and stopped at the black NBA players and pulled out his mace.

BELIEVE IT OR NOT IT GETS WORSE

In the Netflix special, Untold: Malice at the Palace a member of the AHPD says: "if we get the players off the court the fans will calm down." Maybe. How about helping them to the locker room? The truth is not one cop from the AHPD assisted the Pacers into their locker room. They were on their own. In fact when Jermaine O'Neal was being soaked with various beverages, and avoiding thrown food and spittle, an AHPD cop walked past O'Neal. Readers, what happened next is unbelievable, but true. This cop targeted the lone black man, in an ocean of white faces, and maced him. That incident PROVES beyond a shadow of doubt (as if anymore proof was needed) the AHPD was beyond racist on that night. Everything in this expose' is on video. HAVE WE LEARNED ANYTHING?

The answer to the question above is NO! An incident exactly like the Malice at the Palace could happen in metro Detroit today. (Or, anywhere else in the USA). Why? 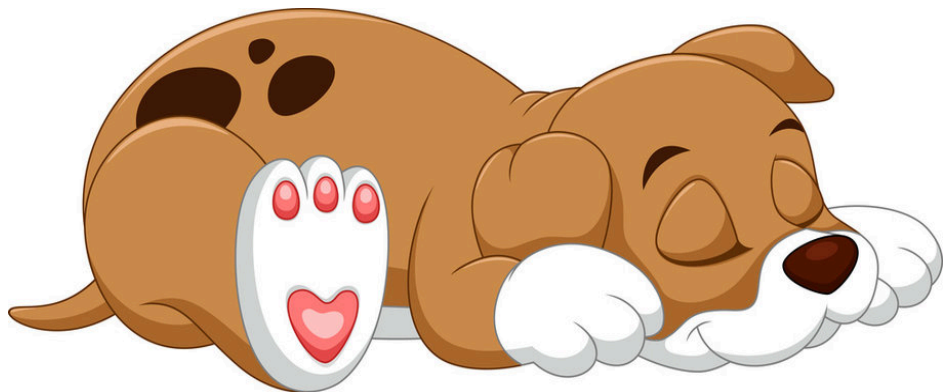

4. INTEREST REDUCTION STIPULATED PAYMENT AGREEMENT:

If eligible, this plan reduces your interest rate from 18% to 6%.
