The Association held its Open Meeting at the Community Hall on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2023. The meeting was well attended and included Councilor Marcus McKenzie from WSC who gave an update on some of the green projects impacting Golden Beach and the surrounding area. The meeting also approved two new members and received a new application to join.

#### **ART GALLERY & INFORMATION CENTRE PROJECT**

The builders time table took a hit with several environmental issues including Fires pushing completion back a couple of weeks.

The contracted Electrician has completed the initial wiring install however is waiting for the builder to finish the internal walls before completing the install of the fixtures.

#### **NEW TOILET BLOCK PROJECT**

The Open Garden is again open with a small work area closed off.

The Association has upgraded the planned Toilet Block amenities to include a wider standard that creates a more inclusive environment for our staff and visitors going forward.

The project's inflationary costs have escalated and the additional improvements require us to increase the fund pool required to complete this important area. The appropriate supporting infrastructure is already in place focus is now on the building component and the required amenities.

## Council helps communities rebuild and stay strong after disasters

Wellington Shire Council has taken significant steps towards empowering and strengthening high-risk communities in the aftermath of disasters through the establishment of Community Recovery Committees (CRCs).

Following severe storm events in 2021, Council secured state government funding through Emergency Recovery Victoria (ERV) to support resilience projects in highly impacted areas through the creation of locally led Community Recovery Committees. The initiative was designed to provide a community-focused approach to recovery, allowing residents to take the lead and shape their recovery and build resilience for the future.

In Wellington Shire, committees were formed in Devon North, Carrajung, Loch Sport and coastal areas.

Under the funding requirements, there are three key themes to guide priorities and projects for individual communities – that being, places of relief; communications; and training community members.

In Devon North and Carrajung, upgrades to community halls are high on the priority list as these initiatives will make a significant impact on the communities' ability to withstand and recover from emergencies.

In the coastal towns of Seaspray and Golden Beach, training initiatives such as mental health and first aid have taken a priority as part of their recovery efforts.

In Loch Sport, the CRC working under the Loch Sport Community House and Public Hall recognised the need for an emergency guide map. The map was designed to highlight important emergency information, including the location of a Neighbourhood Safer Place, defibrillator locations, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) station, and the addresses of key local businesses.

The effectiveness of this emergency guide became evident when the CFA utilised these maps to assist responding Strike Teams to pinpoint properties during the recent and unexpected bushfire in Loch Sport

in early October this year. Currently, Wellington Shire Council is collaborating with the CRC to distribute these maps to all residents of Loch Sport before the peak of summer hits.

Wellington Shire Mayor, Cr Ian Bye emphasised the importance of community-led recovery.

"The Community Recovery Committee's place-based, community-led approach is so important when undertaking recovery work and preparing for the future. We want to make sure our communities are resilient, can lead recovery according to their needs, and are well-prepared and confident in their ability to respond to severe weather events in the future". Cr Bye said.


Building on the important work of the CRCs is the need for emergency preparedness when heading into a hot and dry summer. Earlier this year, Council's Emergency Management team partnered with agencies including Victoria Police, Forest Fire Management Victoria, SES, Red Cross, Country Fire Authority and Ambulance Victoria to conduct emergency preparedness sessions for residents located in communities identified 'most-at-risk'.

To date, sessions in Loch Sport, Seaton, Glenmaggie, Coongulla, Golden Beach, Devon North, Tarra Valley, Carrajung, Woodside, Meerlieu and McLoughlins Beach have been well-attended by the community. They have proven highly informative, offering residents valuable tips and ideas, guidance on keeping informed, and insights into the different roles of local government and emergency services. Sessions have also supported creation of strong relationships and networks amongst neighbours, particularly for newcomers to the area and for more vulnerable community members.

Residents have appreciated the opportunity to engage with multiple emergency service agencies during Q&A sessions, ensuring a well-informed and collaborative approach to local risk management.

The establishment of Community Recovery Committees and the ongoing commitment to community-led recovery highlights the importance of enhancing resilience and preparedness. By working closely with affected communities and stakeholders, small communities will be well-equipped to respond to future disasters and challenges.

The prediction for a long, hot Summer definitely has people a little concerned. Our early wakeup call came in the form of a Watch & Act for Golden/Paradise Beach when the Loch Sport fire had jumped the road. I really want to thank those who heeded the warning and decided to Evacuate. I must say though, I am not impressed with the ones who said they knew it was never going to reach our Community... maybe the Emergency Services could borrow the Crystal Balls!! The Wind change came in an hour earlier than predicted and gave our beautiful area a much-needed reprieve. If you haven't been down Loch Sport Rd since the Fire, go do yourself a favour; it's an eye-opener.

Thank you to the 38 Community Members who came along to the Wellington Shire-organised Preparedness Meeting. We also thank Wellington Shire, Ambulance Vic, SES, CFA Community Ed., VicPol and Forest Fire Management Vic. for the wide variety of Emergency Information delivered.

Some Key points for everyone to keep in mind -

- Have a plan of what you will do in times of emergency have a written plan practice that plan discuss that plan with family, friends and neighbours.
- STICK TO THAT PLAN Last-minute changes are made in times of stress and are detrimental to your safety.
- Include pets in your plan
- Have an evacuation Kit CFA gave out an Evacuation bag and Woollen Blanket at the Meeting A
  list of what to have in that Kit is in this publication.
- Check on Neighbours.

#### **Burning Off**

Golden and Paradise Beach are in a Residential Overlay and CFA has advised that they **WILL NOT** be issuing any **burn-off permits** in the 2023-24 Fire Danger Period; Police <u>WILL</u> attend if property owners want to run the gauntlet.

#### **Camp Fires**

You are permitted to have a Fire for cooking and warmth with some provisos:-

- You use a built Fireplace or dig a 30cm deep Trench
- The Fire Pit should not be more than 1m Square
- Clear an area of 3m surrounding the Fire do not have your fire under trees and remove leaves twigs etc from the 3m perimeter
- Do not use flammable liquid to start the fire
- Have at least a 10lt bucket of water and a shovel nearby DO NOT COVER WITH DIRT/SAND
- Do not leave the Fire unattended
- Supervise children and Pets at all times
- Do not burn dangerous or flammable items such as aerosol cans






