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

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

DRAFT SHORELINE DRIVE LANDSCAPE PLAN - Gippsland Lakes Coastal Park

Tell us what you think

Following community consultation in early 2021, Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation and Parks Victoria have developed a Draft Landscape Plan for the Shoreline Drive area between Paradise Beach and Seaspray in Gippsland Lakes Coastal Park. The development of the Shoreline Drive Landscape Plan is a key strategy identified in the Gunaikurnai and Gippsland Lakes Victorian Government Joint Management Plan for this section of the Gippsland Lakes Coastal Park.

The purpose of the Draft Landscape Plan is to ensure that the Shoreline Drive area of the Gippsland Lakes Coastal Park continues to be a place where visitors can continue to recreate and undertake fishing, camping, beach walking etc, while significantly reducing the harmful impacts that an increase in visitors are having on the cultural heritage, local ecology and visitor experiences. As visitor numbers to the region continue to increase, particularly during peak periods, detrimental impacts across the Park have become unsustainable. These visitor pressures are degrading the natural beauty of the Park. The proposed changes will include additional camping opportunities, increased facilities such as toilets, picnic and bbq facilities and car parking and be important to ensure Country is cared for and can be enjoyed for generations to come.

The Landscape Plan has considered the following uses:

- Day visitor and camping sites
- Boating access
- Beach Access
- Future aspirations of the Gunaikurnai people

Please find attached the Draft Shoreline Drive Landscape Plan Summary Flyer which highlights the guiding principles for the Landscape Plan and the proposed changes. The changes are subject to available funding and will be staged to support implementation.



However The Community Nursery Will Continue To Open Saturday Morning 9.30am to 12.30pm in June & July.

(Subject to Weather Permitting)

The Plant Nursery has now structurally evolved into a better working environment thanks to the many volunteers who have chipped in and given a hand.

An old Caravan has been replaced with a large shade structure that is being used for potting up new plants and a sales area. A recent addition was a Cement Mixing machine that is used to produce the Nursery's own potting mix. (a big thanks shout out to Ray)

We have now increased our stock holding to approximately 1000 plants consisting mainly natives with a mixture of some old fashion favourites.

On order is a Green House Tunnel to improve future tube stock development.





We are also appreciative of the bequeathed donations from past members Evonne and Dot that have replaced the old Shade sail with a permanent structure that now has automatic sprinklers This helps reduce the need for Volunteers to water during hot summer periods and protects the plants.



As we continue going forward the plans are shifting towards providing an office and an area for more social activities within the Nursery.



If someone has a pot belly stove they would like to donate? it would be greatly appreciated and help us get thru these cold periods.
