






Garfield Middle School Students and Staff Return to School March 2021

It soon snowballed from there, where Mr. Braitsch was helping people all over town, but he decided he needed to do more. So, he posted on Facebook if anyone wanted to help him help others. The next thing he knew, he was forming Strangers Helping Strangers!

We are looking to help the elderly, the health-compromised, those who are not able to leave home but need essentials for themselves and their young children, and anyone else in need.

Throughout the pandemic, people have not always been able to provide or get everything they need for themselves and their families. Luckily, Strangers Helping Strangers has been able to provide aid to people whenever they needed it, while also supporting the essential workers.

What types of projects do they work on? In Garfield and other local towns, SHS has been working with the community to help give back during this pandemic, and not just in Jersey. Along with Sergeant Jeff Stewart of the Garfield Police Department, Tara Campistrous of the YMCA, and The Garfield Neighbor Network, SHS traveled to Brooklyn to help NBA player Taj Gibson and his foundation paint new basketball courts that were installed in places such as an old rundown housing project courtyard. This was a major step in getting the youth to help out and get involved, while also providing a place to get exercise and have some fun.





Money has never been a problem for the royals, but in the interview, Harry said the royal family has




"literally cut me off financially".



Nike designs a "Hands Free" sneaker

A 16-year-old boy named Matthew Walzer was born with cerebral palsy. He always loved Nike shoes because they provide the ankle support he needs in order to walk. So, he decided to reach out to his favorite shoe brand on Social Media through Twitter. As luck would have it, Nike had been working with Special Olympians to overcome similar challenges and was thrilled to help Walzer. Little did he know that his heartfelt request would lead to the creation of Go FlyEase — the world's first fully hands-free sneaker.



This all started because Matthew felt that he would need to be able to put on his shoes to become independent as a teenager and adult. “My dream is to go to the college of my choice without having to worry about someone coming to tie my shoes every day. I’ve worn Nike basketball shoes all my life. I can only wear this type of shoe because I need ankle support to walk. At 16 years old, I am able to completely dress myself, but my parents still have to tie my shoes. As a teenager who is striving to become totally self-sufficient, I find this extremely frustrating, and at times, embarrassing.” Matthew Walzer stated at the time.

Though Nike was able to create a custom shoe to meet Walzer's immediate needs, they knew the design could be improved. The Nike design team spent years refining the shoe, sending each version to Walzer for final approval.

The first release of the shoe was in 2015 however, the model was not entirely hands-free. This shoe was created with a collaboration with LeBron James. Then, on February 1st, 2021 the Go Flyease was introduced.

They tested various no-lace solutions, including velcro, zippers, and cable dials, and also drew inspiration from existing Nike shoes, such as the Nike Hyperdunk and the Nike Zoom Soldier, created in collaboration with LeBron James — Walzer's favorite basketball player.

The Nike design team says, “LeBron’s footwear provided the ankle support Matthew needed, but of course, getting into and out of high-top shoes can present its own challenges, so we focused not just on replacing the lacing system but also creating an easier entry system for the foot.”

Unveiled early this year, the revolutionary shoe features a bistable hinge — one that toggles between two different positions. When not worn, the hinge props up, creating a sort of “clog” shape. Angled at about thirty degrees, it allows the foot to slide in easily. Once the foot is in, the hinge snaps shut, and the shoe tightly grasps onto the foot with a suctioning motion. The "clog" arch flattens out to provide cushioning and heel support.



It is fascinating and heartwarming that Nike did all this, and it all started with a post on Twitter. (And you got to be honest those shoes look so cool! I love the colors, the design, and just everything about it!)

On March 25th, *GMS Publishing* students were invited to an open online discussion with *The Record* newspaper's Editor-in-Chief,






