

In every market they serve, they partner with local community resources —such as schools, advocacy groups, community and faith-based organizations, and local businesses — to address community priorities and specific health concerns.


Through Mr. Braitsch, GMS was able to receive 500 donated books and 150 school supply kits on May 7th, 2021.




