





## **Mardi Gras Cinnamon Rolls**

Mardi Gras Cinnamon Rolls are tasty treats that are easy to make!

#### **Ingredients**

Ready-to-bake cinnamon rolls Mardi Gras purple, green, yellow sanding sugar Little plastic baby (optional)

#### **Steps**

Preheat oven to 400F Open Ready-To-Bake cinnamon rolls Separate the Ready-To-Bake cinnamon rolls Place the rolls in a greased cake pan Bake for 13-17 minutes (times may vary by brand)

#### **Decorating**

Cut tip of packet of frosting (included with cinnamon rolls) Drizzle frosting over the hot rolls (DO NOT WAIT UNTIL COOLED) Decorate rolls with the Mardi Gras sanding sugars while frosting is still soft so it will stick

If the plastic baby is used, it can be placed inside one of the rolls before baking. Traditionally, the person who gets the baby has to buy or make the next king cake. Enjoy!




