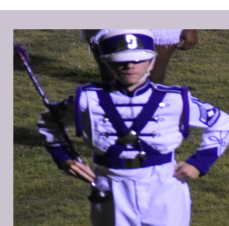

What/ who influenced you?

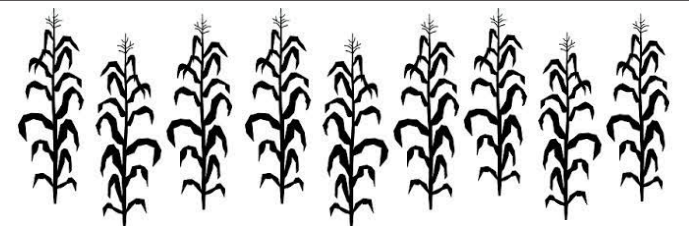
Ava: No one really. I like taking pictures to capture the memories. After taking them, I realized they were good and wanted to enter them.
